CAPT. EVANS TELLS OF RADIO PROGRESS

MUCH RESEARCH IS DONE

Endeavoring to Eliminate Interference by High-Power Stations With Popular Programs

In a statement issued by Captain Waldo Evans, U. S. Navy, the Commandant of the Great Lakes Naval Training Station, an interesting discussion is made of radio progress and activity, which is so closely allied to the United States Navy, and illustrations are made of a few of the major steps taken by the Navy as its contribution to the development of this increasingly important means of communication.

"During the present year," said Captain Evans, "the Bureau of Engineering of the Naval Department has concentrated at the naval research laboratory its research work in radio and underwater sound. This concentration has resulted in an increase of output along these lines. As is characteristic of research work, much was done that proved unprofitable, but the net result has been a direct monetary saving to the government far in excess of the expenditure involved, and, in addition, a marked increase in naval communication efficiency both afloat and ashore.

To Remove Interferences
 "Incident to the phenomenal growth of broadcasting," continued Captain Evans, "it has been found that some of the naval high-power transmitting stations cause interference in reception of radio programs in their immediate vicinity. These stations were constructed at great expense, and money is not available to replace them at once with more modern equipment. An extended study of such interference is being made to find means for removing this objectionable feature without excessive cost to the government.

"A means of multiple reception on a single antenna has been worked out, and trial in service installations shows that vessels are able to receive several messages simultaneously over a single antenna at the same time permitting tube transmitting on most frequencies without interference with this reception. This alone more than doubles the communication efficiency of vessels so fitted.

Recording Apparatus
 "Automatic recording apparatus has been developed which seems to indicate that such apparatus is valuable for ship as well as shore station work.

"Aircraft radio transmitters have been designed with master oscillator to insure a constant wave length. This transmitter makes possible an increase in the number of planes which can be used for spotting purposes.

"Progress has been made in the development of more effective intercommunications between vessels by the use of underwater sound waves, based both on the sonic and supersonic principles.

Develops Speakers
 "A large amount of work has been done in developing loud speakers adaptable for use on battleships for interior communication purposes. The problem of taking sea soundings with sound apparatus has received attention, with the promise that the minimum depth at which reliable sounding can be made will be decreased from about 40 to 5 or 6 fathoms. If successful, this will also supply another aid to navigation that will be of great value to all vessels, especially in thick or foggy weather."
