**NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION**  
 Notice is hereby given to the voters  
 of the City of Highland Park that a  
 special election will be held in and for  
 said City on Saturday, the 15th day  
 of March, A. D. 1924 for the purpose  
 of submitting to the voters, the ques-  
 tion of the annexation to the City of  
 Highland Park the territory de-  
 scribed as follows:

All that part of East Deerfield  
 Township, Lake County, Illinois, de-  
 scribed as follows:  
 Beginning at the intersection of the  
 north line of the South half Sec-  
 tion 10, Township 43 North, Range 12  
 East of the Third Principal Meridian  
 with the westerly line of the right-of-  
 way of the Chicago and North West-  
 ern Railway Company; running thence  
 southeasterly along the said westerly  
 line of the right-of-way of the  
 Chicago and North Western Railway  
 Company to the south line of said  
 Section 10, same being the North Cor-  
 porate Limits of the City of High-  
 wood, running thence west along said  
 south line of said Section 10, being  
 along the north line of said City of  
 Highwood, to the west line of the  
 East Half of Section 15, Township  
 43 North, Range 12 East of the Third  
 Principal Meridian, this point being  
 the northwest corner of the said City  
 of Highwood, running thence south  
 along the said west line of the said  
 East Half of said Section 15, being  
 along the west line of the said City  
 of Highwood, to the south line of  
 said Section 15, this point being the  
 southwest corner of the said City of  
 Highwood, running thence east along  
 the south line of said Section 15, be-  
 ing along the south line of the said  
 City of Highwood to the southeast  
 corner of Section 15, same being the  
 southeast corner of the said City of  
 Highwood, being also a point on the  
 West Corporate Limits of the City  
 of Highland Park, running thence  
 south along the east line of Section  
 22, Township 43 North, Range 12  
 East of the Third Principal Meridian,  
 being the West Corporate Limits of  
 the City of Highland Park, to the  
 south line of the North Half of said  
 Section 22, this point being the north-  
 west corner of Sunset Terrace, being  
 a subdivision in the East Half of the  
 Southeast Quarter of Section 22,  
 Township 43 North, Range 12 East  
 of the Third Principal Meridian, an-  
 nexed to the City of Highland Park  
 by special election held the 18th day  
 of November, A. D. 1922, running  
 thence west along the said south line  
 of the North Half of said Section 22,  
 same line being the new Corporate  
 Limits of the City of Highland Park,  
 to the west line of the East Half of  
 the Southeast Quarter of said Section  
 22, this point being the northwest cor-  
 ner of said Sunset Terrace, running  
 thence south along the said west line  
 of the East Half of the Southeast  
 Quarter of said Section 22, being the  
 new West Corporate Limits of the  
 City of Highland Park, to the south  
 line of said Section 22, this point be-  
 ing the southwest corner of said Sun-  
 set Terrace, thence east along the  
 south line of said Section 22, being  
 the new Corporate Limits of the said  
 City of Highland Park, to its inter-  
 section with the center line of Central  
 Avenue in said Highland Park, run-  
 ning thence northeasterly along the  
 said center line of said Central Ave-  
 nue, being the new Corporate Limits  
 of the said City of Highland Park,  
 to the east line of said Section 22,  
 this point being the southeast corner  
 of said Sunset Terrace Subdivision;  
 running thence south along the east  
 line of Sections 22 and 27, Township  
 43 North, Range 12 East of the Third  
 Principal Meridian, being the West  
 Corporate Limits of the said City of  
 Highland Park, to the southeast cor-  
 ner of said Section 27, Township 43  
 North, Range 12 East of the Third  
 Principal Meridian; said corner being  
 the southwest corner of that part of  
 the City of Highland Park lying  
 north of the north line of Section 35,  
 Township 43 North, Range 12 East  
 of the Third Principal Meridian; run-  
 ning thence east along the north line  
 of said Section 35 and Section 36,  
 Township 43 North, Range 12 East  
 of the Third Principal Meridian, be-  
 ing the corporate limits of said City  
 of Highland Park, to the east line of  
 the right-of-way of the Chicago and  
 North Western Railway Company,  
 running thence southeasterly along  
 the said easterly line of the Chicago  
 and North Western Railway Com-  
 pany, being the West Corporate Lim-  
 its of the said City of Highland Park,  
 to the south line of said Section 36,  
 this point being the southwest corner  
 of the City of Highland Park; run-  
 ning thence west along the south line  
 of Sections 36, 35 and 34, Township  
 43 North, Range 12 East of the Third  
 Principal Meridian, same line being  
 the south line of East Deerfield Town-  
 ship, to the southwest corner of said  
 Section 34, said corner being the  
 southwest corner of East Deerfield  
 Township; running thence north  
 along the west lines of Sections 34,  
 27, 22, 15 and 10, said Township 43  
 North, Range 12 East of the Third  
 Principal Meridian, same being the  
 west line of East Deerfield Town-  
 ship, to the north line of the South  
 Half of Section 10, Township 43 North,  
 Range 12 East of the Third Principal  
 Meridian; running thence east along  
 the said north line of the South Half  
 of Section 10, to the point of begin-  
 ning.

Each of the election precincts of  
 said City be and it is hereby declared  
 and created an election district or  
 precinct; that the voting places in  
 said for each of said precincts shall  
 be as follows:

First Precinct—City Hall, 549  
 Central Avenue.  
 Second Precinct—Methodist Church  
 Cor. North Ave. and Lauretta Place.  
 Third Precinct—H. M. Prior's  
 Office, 27 N. Sheridan Road.  
 Fourth Precinct—Lake Shore  
 Motors Co., 55 S. St. Johns Ave.  
 Fifth Precinct—Mrs. Fred Lind-  
 holm's Residence, 1453 Judson Ave-  
 nue.

The polls of said election will be  
 opened at 7:00 o'clock in the morning  
 and will continue open until 5:00  
 o'clock in the evening of Saturday,  
 March 15th, 1924.

**GIVES RULING ON  
 MOTOR LICENSES**  
 Every Person, Firm or Corpora-  
 tion Carrying Freight  
 Must Pay Tax

Every firm, person or corporation  
 in Illinois carrying passengers  
 or freight in motor vehicles,  
 for hire, operating regularly on  
 fixed or definite routes on im-  
 proved highways, is required to  
 pay a "prorata license fee, as pro-  
 vided in section 9A of the motor ve-  
 hicle law," according to an opinion of  
 Attorney General Edward J. Brun-  
 dage, delivered to Secretary of State  
 Louis L. Emmerson.

"Section 9A of the motor vehicle  
 law," Mr. Brundage said, "applies to  
 all vehicles, trailers and semitrailers  
 used for carrying freight for hire and  
 also all vehicles, trailers and semi-  
 trailers of the second division, as de-  
 scribed in section No. 2 of said act,  
 used for carrying passengers for hire  
 and operating regularly.

"The second division of section  
 No. 2 of said act includes these ve-  
 hicles which are designed and used for  
 pulling and carrying freight, and also  
 those vehicles or motor cars which  
 are designed and used for the car-  
 rying of more than seven persons."

Prior to the amendment approved  
 June 29, 1923, section 9A provided,  
 Mr. Brundage said; that for the use  
 of all vehicles of the classes above  
 mentioned an additional license fee  
 should be paid monthly, "on or be-  
 fore the tenth of each month" for  
 the preceding calendar month. "This  
 provision he continued, "was  
 changed by the amendment so as to  
 provide as follows:

"Such additional license fee shall  
 be payable annually to the secretary  
 of state on or before January 1 or  
 within 10 days from the time any  
 person enters into the business of  
 operating such vehicles for hire, but  
 the fee herein provided for shall be  
 reduced by one-half for the first year  
 any person engages in such business  
 if he begins operations after July 1  
 of such year."

"It is apparent," the attorney gen-  
 eral said, "that the payment of addi-  
 tional fee, as provided by this amend-  
 ment, was intended to be made in  
 lieu of the monthly payments requir-  
 ed by the former provisions of this  
 section, which were omitted in the  
 amendatory act, which became effec-  
 tive July 1, 1923."
