#### Happenings of Interest Here and There About This Section Of The North Shore, County Seat

Lester Tiffany last week was appointed chief deputy sheriff of Lake county by Sheriff Edwin Ahlstrom, following 17 months service as a deputy. The position had been vacant for several months.

Miss Birdella Flood, an employe of the Lake County Title & Trust gave almost a pint of blood last week to her sister, Irma, at the Victory Memorial hospital, where she underwent a transfusion performed by members of the Lake County Clinic.

A dispatch from Washington shows that allotments from current rivers and harbors appropriations include \$30,000 for the Chicago river, amount being transferred from the Waukegan Harbor appropriation.

Miss Candace Schofield, 84 years old, died at her home, 219 Sherman place, death following a lingering illness brought on by paralysis. Miss Schofield was born in the town of York, Ohio.

Chiropractors of Lake county held a meeting in Waukegan last week at which they perfected an organization.

Thirty-four men and women took the oath of allegiance to the United States last week at the court house in one of the most impressive naturalization programs ever celebrated in Lake county.

Fred Beckert, who pleaded guilty to having burglarized the home of Olive Runnels of Lake Forest, was sentenced to serve from one to twenty years in the state penitentiary.

#### SCORES MODERN WAY OF LIVING; REMEDY

#### Preacher Plays Machine-Like Existence; Too Little of Culture, He Says

Modern men are "caught in the coils of a mighty engine that grinds the life out of them for no national and justifiable end," declares Rev. E. J. Campbell, D. D., one of England's best known religious publicists.

Modern industrial civilization, on the whole is a bad thing, Rev. Campbell states, and declares that the time has come when it should be replaced by a "surer and more harmonious mode of regulating our common activities."

"We live too much by mechanism and too little by culture values," the doctor says. "We tend to think always in terms of the machine; it is ever in the foreground of our vision, and if we could manage to alter the perspective drastically we should be all the better for it."

"Our inventions and discoveries are nearly all in the direction of speeding up—but for what? We are disemboweling Nature as fast as we can, but we grow no happier in the process; rather the contrary."

"One of the greatest anomalies of the age is that, with all our vastly accelerated methods of producing material wealth, we have not yet learned how to enjoy it. We toil harder than ever; the strain of living becomes more intense; its demands upon us grow rapidly greater, without any corresponding accession of general well-being."

"The thing is so foolish that we should have done with it if we were not so deeply immersed in it and so completely fashioned by it as to take it for granted."

"The remedy does not lie in the hands of any one man or any one government. It will involve an entire change of outlook on the part of civilized mankind; and this may come sooner than we dare hope."

"Some day we may realize that the scramble is not worth while, that our material gains are too dearly purchased, and that, without losing anything worth retaining, we can slow down and take more time to think about what man is than about what he has."
