TO LIMIT WEIGHT OF LOADED TRUCKS

DURING THE EARLY SPRING

Highway Commissioners Act to Protect on Unpaved Roads for 30 Days While Frost Comes Out

A protection to the unpaved roads in Lake County during the thawing season was arranged at a meeting of all the highway officials at the Chamber of Commerce rooms in Waukegan last week, when they put a weight embargo on all but the paved state highways for the next 30 days and if the frost is not out of the ground and the roads dried up, the embargo will be continued for another 30 days.

During the spring of the year the wear and tear on unpaved roads is greater than at any other time and when heavy trucks travel over the roads while they are soft, the damage done the roads costs hundreds of dollars to repair.

At the meeting last week it was voted to limit the weight of all truck loads traveling over the unpaved roads and a heavy fine has been fixed to be charged against all violators. A truck with hard rubber tires must not weigh more, including the load, than 8,000 pounds, and trucks with pneumatic tires, including load weight, must not weigh more than 10,000 pounds. This is a very reasonable limit as other counties in this vicinity have set the weight limit to 6,000 pounds regardless of the kind of tires used.

Stephen A. Day, Candidate for Attorney General Fights Ring Politics
