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**SCIENCE PREDICTS ADVANCE IN YEAR**

**GREAT STRIDES IN 1924**

**Nineteen-Twenty-Four May Be Greatest in History in This Line; Atom Is Analyzed**

The year 1924 may be the most important year in the history of Science. Scientific leaders declare that laboratories the world over are buzzing with activity, and 1924 may see many of nature's hidden secrets revealed.

"It is possible that the world is on the verge of far-reaching scientific discoveries," declared Sir William Bragg, director of the Royal Institute laboratories, London, England.

"It is, of course, impossible to say what the nature of these discoveries may be. Research work is being pursued all over the country, and the scientific mind hesitates to proclaim a discovery until there is absolute certainty.

"There are secrets of the atom still to be unveiled. Theoretically we know quite a lot about the atom, but in reality we still do not know exactly what it is and the full nature of its powers. There is an immense field for investigation here, and each step in the exploration is not only a triumph for science, but, let us hope, will mark a forward step in the happiness of humanity.

Depends on Use

"It all depends upon the uses to which mankind puts scientific discovery. A new element misused may prove disastrous. There is the case of poison gas in warfare; but properly understood and harnessed to man's services, it may be of incalculable benefit. We cannot tell; our province as scientists is to discover the hidden thing in the first place.

"We have every-day evidence of the force which the atom mass formation can produce. The whole material is an expression of this. The hidden energy that lies within the structure of the atom itself has yet to be realized."

"Would the explosion of an atom have the catastrophic results which are sometimes predicted?" Sir William was asked. "Would it mean the end of the world?"

"Well, I scarcely think so," he answered. "But one cannot say. It is not possible to prophesy what might happen. It is more hopeful to think of the world-wide interest in scientific research and to realize that we are now in a great era of discovery."

**FOREIGNERS AIDED IN ENGLISH STUDY**

**American of Polish Ancestry Is Teacher of Alien Students in Chicago**

Foreigners in Chicago to the number of 3,987 have learned English from an American citizen of Polish parentage, named Michael P. Szymanski of 2950 Edgewood Avenue.

For twelve years, Szymanski has been teaching English to foreigners in both the day and evening schools of the Division Street Y. M. C. A. and in factories in the vicinity to a total of nearly ten thousand students.

His friends claim he has taught more foreigners to speak and understand English than any other person.

Szymanski is an American citizen who graduated from the State Normal School at Stevens Point, Wis., and prepared himself for the profession of teaching as his life work.

Mr. Szymanski is skilled in drawing pictures of objects on the blackboard, with words beautifully written or printed beneath. With this as an aid, he has been especially successful in helping foreigners to understand the intricacies of the American language.

"I expect to spend the rest of my life in helping to make foreign born men into good Americans," Mr. Szymanski said, when questioned regarding his plans. "These helpless foreigners are constantly at the mercy of crooks and sharpers, until they can understand our language. I don't know anything that gives more satisfaction than to open up the English tongue to these helpless Poles, Russians, Germans, and others and see the light flash up in their stolid faces, when they begin to understand our language."

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**PAINTINGS DEPICT HUMAN PROGRESS**

Mural paintings depicting the progress of human life from the first half-human anthropoid apes to a high state of primitive culture are to be an educational and decorative feature of the Logan Museum at Beloit College, Beloit, Wis. John W. Norton of the Art Institute is making a series of sixteen pictures which are to tell the story of early man. Mr. Norton has been concerned chiefly with the artistic presentation of these scenes, but the work also involves considerable scientific research, for the customs of the Neanderthals, Cromagnons, Lake Dwellers and other primitive peoples must be accurately represented. The Logan Museum is the gift of the Logan Museum at Beloit College of Mr. and Mrs. Frank C. Logan, who are both loyal friends to the institution and interested patrons of archaeology. Mr. Logan, who is vice-president of the Art Institute, recently received the honorary degree of doctor of laws from the college. The Logan Museum had its beginnings in 1893 when a valuable collection of early Indian implements and weapons was shown at the World's Fair. Mr. Logan purchased the collection and presented it to the college. Mr. Logan is also the founder of the Collie chair of anthropology at Beloit.



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
