SCIENCE PREDICTS ADVANCE IN YEAR

GREAT STRIDES IN 1924

Nineteen-Twenty-Four May Be Greatest in History in This Line; Atom Is nalyzed

The year 1924 may be the most important year in the history of Science. Scientific leaders declare that laboratories the world over are buzzing with activity, and 1924 may see many of nature's hidden secrets revealed.

"It is possible that the world is on he verge of far-reaching scientific liscoveries," declared Sir William Bragg, director of the Royal Institute aboratories, Ipndon, England.

"It is, of course, impossible to say that the nature of these discoveries may be. Research work is being pursued all over the country, and the scientific mind heritates to proclaim a discovery until there is absolute cer

"There are serrets of the atom still to be unveiled. Theoretically we know quite a lot about the atom, but in reality we still do not know exactly what it is and the full nature of its powers. There is an immense field for investigation here, and each step in the exploration is not only a tri-umph for science, but, let us hope, will mark a forward step in the happiness of humanity.

Depends on Use "It all depends upon the uses to which mankind pats scientific discovery. A new element misused may prove disastrous. There is the case of poison gas in warfare; but properly inderstood and harnessed to man's services, it may be of incalculable benefit. We cannot tell; our province as scientists is to discover the hidden thing in the first place.

"We have every-day evidence of the force which the atom mass formafion can produce. The whole material is an expression of this. The hidden energy that les within the structure of the atom atself has yet to be realized."

"Would the explosion of an atom have the catastrophic results which are sometimes predicted?" Sir William was asked. Would it mean the end of the world?

"Well, I scarcely thinks so," he answered. "But one cannot say. It is not possible to prophery what might happen. It is more hopeful to think of the world-wide interest in scientific research and to realize that we are now in a great era of discovery."

FOREIGNERS AIDED IN ENGLISH STUDY

American of Polish Ancestry Is Teacher of Agien Students In Chicago

Foreigners in Clicago to the number of 9,987, have learned English from an American citizen of Polish parentage, named Michael P. Szy-

manski of 2950 Edgewood Avenue. For twelve years, Syzmanski has been teaching English to foreigners in both the day and evening schools of the Division Street Y. M. C. A. and in factories in the vicinity to a total of nearly ten thousand students. His friends claim he has taught more foreigners to speak and understand English than any other per-

Syzmanski is an American citizen who graduated from the State Normal School at Stevens Point, Wisc., and prepared himself for the profession of teaching as his life work.

Mr. Syzmanski is skilled in drawing pictures of objects on the blackboard, with words beautifully written or printed beneath. With this as an aid, he has been especially successful in helping foreigners to understand the intricacies of the Ameri-

"I expect to spend the rest of my life in helping to make foreign born men into good Americans," Mr. Syzmanski said, when questioned regarding his plans. These helpless foreigners are constantly at the mercy of crooks and sharpers, until they can understand our language. I don't know anything that gives more satisfaction than to open up the English tongue to these helpless Poles, Russians, Germans, and others and see the light flash up in their stolid faces, when they begin understand our language."


