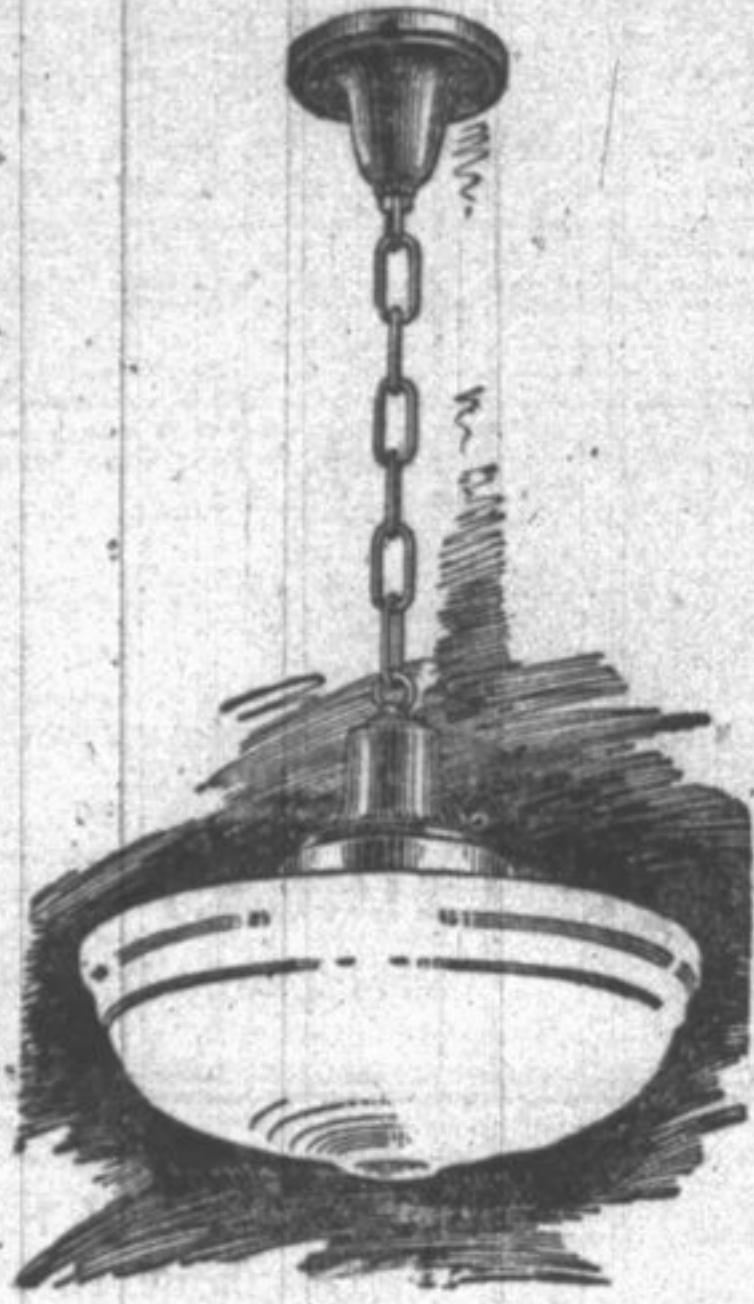

BRIEF NEWS ITEMS FROM LAKE COUNTY

NEIGHBORHOOD JOTTINGS

Interesting Happenings About This Part of North Shore and Doings at the County Seat

Lewis O. Brockway, recorder of deeds and clerk of the circuit court, completed his 30th years' work in that office last week.

A ring of expert counterfeiters has been broken up in Waukegan and seven men are under arrest in Chicago.

Fifteen new motor cars have been purchased for Waukegan service by the North shore line, George Kenry of the line announced last week.

Mrs. Mary Jane Bond, 59 years old, of Gurnee, died last week, after a long illness. She was the mother of three children, two daughters and a son.

John S. Clark, superintendent of the public grade schools at Waukegan has been re-elected to the position for the year 1924-1925.

Work of building the protection structures at the First National bank waukegan, preparatory to the building of a new home for the bank has been started, lumber having arrived on the premises.

From the list of one hundred and fifteen students graduating from the Waukegan Township high school this spring, forty-five, of this number have specialized in commercial training. This training comprises a two-year course in accounting and a two-year course in stenography and typewriting, and a one year course in office practice work.

Newport township recently voted a \$44,000 bond issue. This together with other road funds to come in this year will make over \$50,000 for road purposes. This money will probably be used to gravel all the earth roads in the township.

Judge Edward D. Shurtleff of Mar-engo, was elected presiding judge of the appellate court for the third district at Springfield last week. The appointment is for one year and was made by judges of the appellate court at the state capital when they met for the April term.

With Grand Exalted Ruler O'Keefe of this district in charge and the officers of the Highland Park lodge of Elks putting on the ceremonies, the newly elected officers of Waukegan Lodge No. 702, Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks, were installed last week.

WEALTH OF COUNTRY BOOSTED IN DECADE

All Classes of Property in U. S. Increased in 10 Years Except Livestock

The wealth of the nation is \$320,803,862,000, or \$2,918 per capita. But more than one-half of it is real property and improvements.

The figures, stating conditions on December 31, 1922, were issued today by the census bureau. They revealed that the total wealth increased 72.2 per cent, and the per capita wealth 49.6 per cent in the ten years from 1912.

All classes of property increased in value in the decade except livestock which decreased 6.9 per cent to \$5,807,104,000.

The increases in money value of other classes of property, census bureau officials state, are to a large extent due to the rise in prices.

Taxed real property and improvements were valued at \$155,908,652,000, an increase of 60.9 per cent, exempt real property (exclusive of national parks and monuments), \$20,505,819,000, an increase of 66.5 per cent; farm implements and machinery, \$2,604,638,000, an increase of 90.4 per cent; manufacturing machinery, tools and implements, \$15,783,260,000, an increase of 159.1 per cent; railroads and their equipment, \$19,950,300,000, an increase of 23.5 per cent.

Privately owned transportation and transmission enterprises other than railroads, were valued at \$13,607,570, an increase of 42.1 per cent.

The value of the United States navy is placed at \$1,455,992,000, an increase of 259.4 per cent; privately owned waterworks, \$360,885,000, an increase of 24.4 per cent; and gold and silver coin and bullion, \$4,278,155,000, an increase of 63.5 per cent.

COUNTY BOARD TO MEET ON APRIL 16

Lew A. Hendee, county clerk has called a special meeting of the board of supervisors for April 16, at which time a new chairman will be elected. The meeting was called by petition of the supervisors.

So far the only avowed candidate for the chairmanship is E. A. Martin, of Millburn. The name of Fred Kirschner of Cuba township has been mentioned, but so far he has not stated definitely, that he will enter the race. Supervisor Kirschner was chairman several years ago.
