

In discussing "Life under the Lens," Prof. C. E. Tharaldsen, of the zoology department of Northwestern University, re-emphasizes the theory that all human characteristics are primarily derived from and handed down by germ-cells of the human body and not by so-called body cells.

NO UNEMPLOYMENT IN SIGHT, REPORT

Building Trades Promise Work For Months, According to Survey Report

Continuous employment for the rest of the year in the building trades, and plenty of work in agricultural occupations, are indicated, in a survey completed by Charles J. Boyd, general superintendent of the Illinois Free

Employment Service.

There is an increase of 88 per cent in the number of jobs available on farms, Mr. Boyd said, and while some slackening up can be expected in all lines of industry it will be mostly sea-

"Building permits," he asserted, are only slightly under those of a year ago, but there are enough projects on hand in Chicago and vicinity to assure almost continuous employment for those engaged in this indus-

"There has not been much change in our ration of applications to the number of jobs open. In March there were 157.8 applications for each 100 jobs and in February 150.8.

"The Chicago office registered 319 more persons for March than for February, while the opportunities for employment were 82 less, but the actual number of placements made was 417

greater. "The March activity in building showed an increase of approximately 64 per cent in the number of jobs available, while the metal and machinery industry showed about onethird less | Common labor ran about 10 per cent below the previous

In the dewnstate regions, Mr. Boyd said, reports indicate about the same conditions as in Chicago, but he said he believed that as the season advanced and road building, street improvements and public work get well under way they will take care of the present labor surplus and a great deal of what may be created by the slackening up of industries.
