DAVIS ON IMMIGRATION

In a recent article in the Saturday Evening Post, Secretary of Labor James J. Davis, who has made an exhaustive study of the subject, thus forcefully sums up his views on immigration:

"Daily the political, economic and social problems which confront us are increasing in number and seriousness. Daily new dangers to American institutions arise about us, new complications develop in our national life. The difficulties of today are greater than those of yesterday, and those of tomorrow will be greater than those of today. To cope with these manifold problems we must have a race of real Americans, strong in body, sound in mind and healthy of soul. On one point I am very clear: We need an immigration policy and an immigration law, that will operate solely for the benefit of America—America today and America in the future. We are under no obligation, moral or legal, to allow any nation in all the world to say whom we shall accept as citizens of the United States, or even as residents of the United States. Immigration, is the final working out of the problem, is an American issue. It is the right—yes, it is the duty of the United States to protect every American citizen, of today and of tomorrow, from contact with the mental, moral and physical delinquents of all the world."

AMERICA IS SOUND

President Coolidge is giving the country straight talk. He seems instinctively to understand the people and unerringly interprets their sentiments. Listen to this from his address before the Associated Press recently in New York:

"Fundamentally America is sound. It has both the power and disposition to maintain itself in a healthy economic and moral condition. But it can not do this by turning all its thoughts on itself, or by making its material prosperity its supreme choice. Selfishness is only another name for suicide. A nation that is morally dead will soon be financially dead. The progress of the world rests on courage, honor and faith. If America wishes to maintain its prosperity it must maintain its ideals.

"If there is one ideal of national existence to which America has adhered more consistently than to any other, it has been that of peace. Whatever other faults may be charged to our country, it has never been quarrelsome, belligerent or bent on military aggrandizement. After all, the main support of peace is understanding. It is a matter of accurate information by one government and one people about other governments and other peoples. There is likewise involved the same law of service.

"If our country is to stand for anything in the world, it is to represent any forward movement in human progress, these achievements will be measured in no small degree by what it is able to do for others."

SMOKE SCREEN FROM AIRPLANES TESTED

New Stunt for Concealment in Warfare Is Tried Out By U. S. Aviators

The chemical warfare section of the army has developed an airplane smoke screen which by dropping a small quantity of liquid chemical from the ship while in the air makes a screen below it 1200 yards long and 250 yards high, effectively hiding the plane from terrestrial observation, it was learned today.

By controlling the size of the drops the aviator can tilt it with one end on the ground and the other in the air.

This innovation is made possible by the recent discovery of a chemical called titanium tetrachloride.
