TEN MILLIONTH CAR CROSSING CONTINENT Ford Company Sending It With Message From New York Mayor to Frisco Bearing a written message from Mayor Hylan of New York to Mayor Rolph of San Francisco the ten millionth Ford car, heading westward on its trans-continental trip over the Lincoln Highway, is somewhere in the mineral state of Pennsylvania.

From New York to Philadelphia, and then toward the setting sun the ten millionth was accompanied by many other Ford cars sent by dealers along the way to do honor to this historic member of the great Ford family. The start from New York was auspicious. Proceeding from the Ford Motor company branch at 1710 Broadway about 10 a. m. Monday, June 16th, the car went directly to Times Square. Its arrival immediately attracted thousands of passers-by on the famous thoroughfare. J. Newton Gunn, president of the Lincoln Highway association, was present and officially started the car on its trip to the west coast. The car is scheduled to arrive in Chicago on June 28.
