ONE DEAD AND TWO HURT IN ACCIDENT

Fatality on Motor Road Near Gurnee Bridge Last Week Is Reported

One man is dead, another was taken to his home suffering from deep lacerations and bruises and a third is congratulating himself on a narrow escape from death following misjudgment of roads at the new Gurnee bridge one day last week. MORE CITIES JOIN PRODUCTS EXHIBIT

TO BE SHOWN NEXT FALL

Chicago Display of Output of Many Illinois Towns To Be Interesting In Various Ways

Progressive Illinois cities with live chambers of commerce are preening themselves in preparation for the grand looking-over that the outside world will give this state at the Illinois Products Exposition next fall.

Far-sighted business men, from the smallest retailers to giant utility companies, predict an influx of new establishments when Illinois has told her story at the American Exposition Palace, 606 Lake Shore Drive, Chicago, where the ten-day exposition will open amid the Chicago day festivities Oct. 9. A "new-factory" information bureau will be one of the features of the exposition.

To Bring Industries That a veritable "march of the smokestacks" into the state will be a natural result of its manifestation of advantages is the opinion of experienced observers. Industrial engineers report a large number of factories in the east that intend to locate somewhere in the middle west.

Competition for a share of the fresh capital, with its inevitable appendage of added population, already has grown keen. Men in a position to know predict that some small cities will double in size in the year following the exposition, in consequence of the exhibits and arguments they will present.

Many a modest violet, say these wise ones, has slumbered for years amid ideal surroundings for new factory locations while billions of dollars have flowed past its doors or stepped over its head, ignorant even of its existence.

Seed Representation Since the purpose and scope of the Illinois Chamber of Commerce enterprise has become known through the state, a number of these modest violets have lifted their heads and announced a determination to find a place in the sun by engaging booth space at the "made or grown in Illinois" exposition.

The beautiful and splendidly-located little city of Sycamore, for instance, as smart a place as any business man's wife could wish to live in, jumped to the front soon after the books were opened at the Otis building headquarters and snapped up one of the choicest spots in the vast building. Nor was Sycamore's Chamber of Commerce satisfied with one booth. Sycamore took two.

The Galesburg Chamber of Commerce put Knox county on the map in big league style by engaging four booths in a row.

The Park Ridge Commercial association, caring not that only a street line separates Park Ridge from Chicago, will have a community exhibit. DeKalb's banner will flaunt high, alongside Lawrenceville's, in the parade of the towns with room for more smokestacks. Community representation by cities not averse to additional payrolls also will be made by Cairo, Jacksonville, Ottawa, and others.

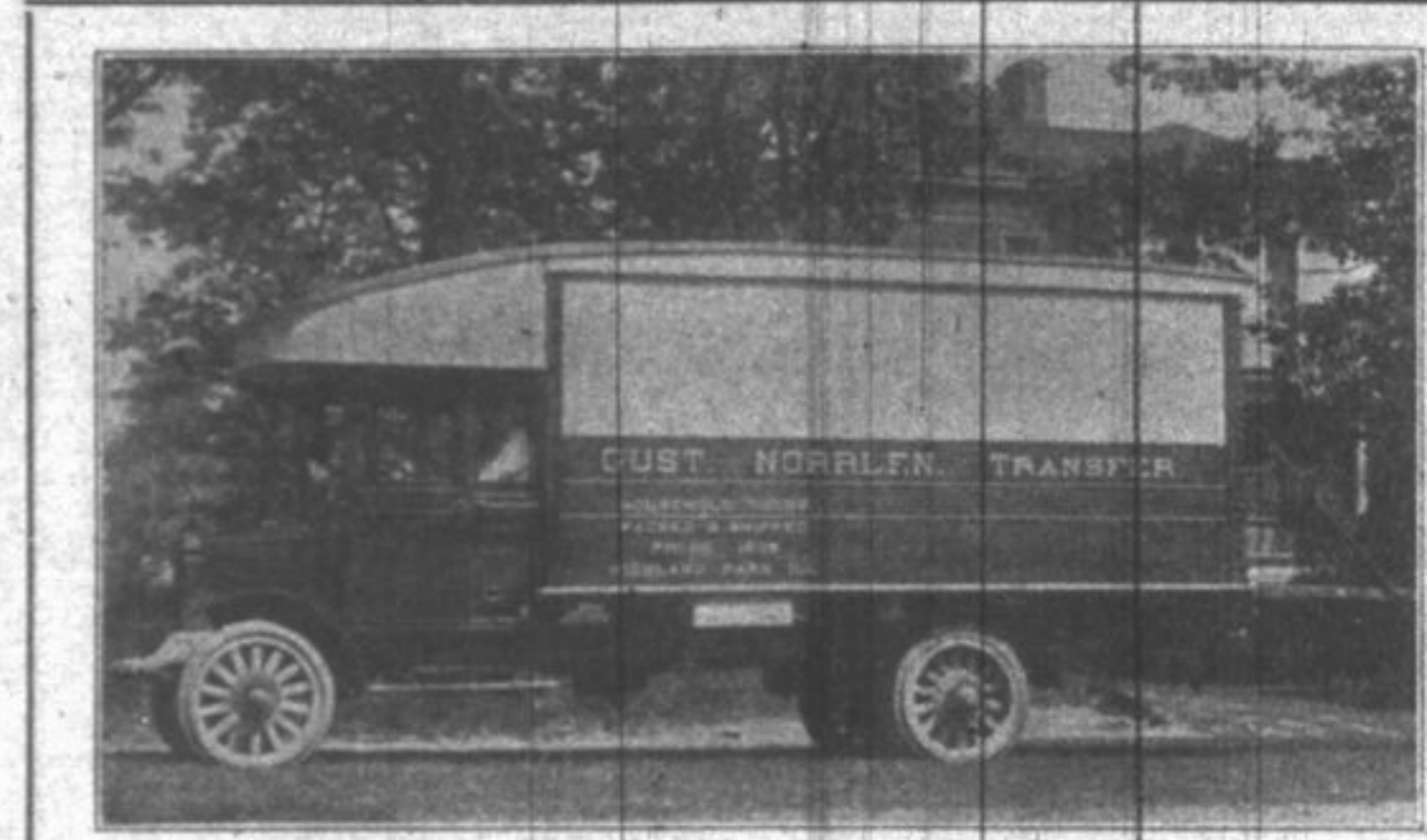
LINCOLN UNIVERSITY OPEN IN SEPTEMBER
