**STUDYING ROADS LEADING TO CITY**

Government Officials Investigating Transportation By Trucks

Chicago may easily qualify as the highway freighting center of the United States, according to federal authorities who launched a new investigation last week to discover just how important truck transportation from the Chicago terminal is to national commerce.

The study which will probably extend to Indianapolis, Detroit, St. Louis, Milwaukee and other commercial centers, was ordered by Prof. J. G. McKay, chief of the division of highway economics for the U. S. bureau of public roads. He arrived several days ago from Washington to check over the first results of the joint government and county highway survey now well along on Cook county roads, and has remained to work out the new transportation survey which is expected to extend over some eight months as a government measure.

Accurate information as to the amount of truck traffic, the kind of freight carried, routes used, points of departure and destination, ownership, profits and like data, will be gathered. All trucks in this area will be enumerated by capacity and listed as to ownership and maps will be prepared showing the principal sources of highway freight in connection with railroad facilities and industries.
