MASTER CONTROL OF CAR IS REQUISITE

"Motorists should spend a few minutes each day trying to perfect themselves in some one feature of the car's control," says a bulletin issued by the accident prevention department of the Chicago Motor club.

"Practice makes perfect," this bulletin states. "Too many accidents are passed off as the result of 'circumstances' whereas the fact of the matter is that many accidents could be avoided by a little better understanding of the handling of the car. The average automobile driver stops trying to be skillful once he has overcome the early timidity which troubles him during his experiences as a beginner. Just at this point he stops being a safe and desirable automobile citizen.

"There are many local motorists whose experience is extensive in point of years but whose skill is so limited that they are unable to shift from 'high' to 'second' without virtually coming to a stop. These people are in a bad way when their brakes fail them in descending hills. They should consider it a duty to make an effort to master such features of driving before tempted to offer the shop-worn excuse of helplessness if something happens."

BRIEF NEWS ITEMS FROM LAKE COUNTY

NEIGHBORHOOD JOTTINGS

Happenings Here and There On The North Shore in This Vicinity and at The County Seat

Burglars entered the A. Carney store in North Genesee street, Waukegan, last week, and carried away clothing valued at \$500.

The Lake County Medical society, some 75 strong, including friends and relatives, enjoyed their annual picnic on Bangs lake near Wauconda last week.

The fourth annual picnic of the Lake County Farm bureau was held at Diamond lake Aug. 20. Arrangements were made for the entertainment of at least 2,500 persons, including the members of the bureau and their families.

A modern subdivision containing 120 beautiful homes, costing \$10,000 is to be located at Area, Ill., adjoining beautiful Lake Eara and St. Mary's of the Lake, the catholic seminary in course of construction there.

J. M. Graves, aged 64 years, of Waukegan, was stricken on the way home from work one day last week, and died within 15 minutes after the attack at the Victory Memorial hospital where he had been rushed in an automobile.

Four alleged beer runners, three trucks and 27 barrels of beer were captured last week by four motorcycle officers at Belvidere and Milwaukee roads.

An intensive drive to raise \$100,000 and thereby relieve the Victory Memorial hospital from its building debt, was decided upon Tuesday night at a meeting of the board of directors of the hospital association at Waukegan. The drive will be launched during the first week in October.

The finding of bloodstained clothing hidden away in a cottage at Fox lake may prove a clue that will lead to the identity of the slayers of William E. Robertson, Fox Lake telegraph operator, whose mangled body was found strewn along the St. Paul railroad tracks at that place recently.

A high water mark for August for many years has been reached with the rising of the Fox river near Elgin, as a result of the heavy rainfall according to reports received at Waukegan.

CORPORATIONS PAY STATE \$5,000,000

Collections of Fees Under New Code Greatly Increased, Report Says

The new corporation code of Illinois, enacted under the administration of Secretary of State Louis L. Emmerson, has resulted in total fee collections amounting to almost \$5,000,000 a year. This money goes directly into the treasury and serves to reduce the amount to be raised by general taxation.

Prior to the beginning of Secretary Emmerson's administration, fees paid in by corporations amounted to only about \$600,000 per year. Last year, foreign corporations paid in \$1,625,000 and domestic corporations \$3,045,000. There are a total of 30,000 corporations.

FAITHFUL DOG WAITS FOR MASTER IN VAIN

"Old Shep" is waiting for his master. All day long he lies on his master's coat at Oakland, Illinois, appearing to get some comfort out of the garment. At times he lifts his big sad shepherd dog eyes to visitors as if appealing to them for some word of his master.

If the visitors could make him understand they would tell him that his master, Leroy Honn, will never return to the farm home. Honn and his wife were killed by a train at the farm gate. HALF OF COUNTIES TO MAKE COW TEST

More Than 50 Have Made Appropriations For That Purpose, Says Report

More than one half of the 102 counties in Illinois have made appropriations to test all cattle in the county for tuberculosis, according to reports to the state department of agriculture. These counties, 57 in number, have two thirds of the state's cattle. Information here indicates that Illinois is further advanced in the work of ridding cattle of tuberculosis than any other state in the union.
