LARGE ATTENDANCE AT CORNERSTONE LAYING

Presbyterian Church at Northbrook Holds Appreciative Ceremonies

The corner stone of the Northbrook Presbyterian church was laid last Sunday in the presence of a large audience, and with the help of visiting Presbyterian ministers.

The choir led in the singing of especially appropriate hymns, and Mrs. Everett right sang just the right selection for the occasion.

Mrs. Magill of Wilmette and Fitt of Highland Park gave the kind of addresses too seldom heard at such ceremonies, in their being both a mental stimulus and it being brief.

Attention was given to the early history of the Hope Union Church, which in 1922 became a Presbyterian church, and the present minister declared that the church of today had not supplanted but was supplementing the work of the original church. Two of the charter members of Hope Church were present, Mrs. Walter, and Charles B. Kiest. Mrs. Walter was introduced as a foster mother of five children who were living to bless her memory, and Mr. Kiest had a part with the other Elders in the ceremony of the laying of the stone.

The copper box sealed within the stone, had as contents: copies of the Cook County Herald, and the Highland Park Press; copy of the early history of the Hope Union Church; copy of the annual report of the Board of Church Extension of the Presbytery of Chicago, with which the Northbrook is affiliated, copy of the printed matter sent out as information of the plans for building; copy of the program of the day, and list of the officers of the Village of Northbrook.

The audience including a fine delegation from the Highland Park Presbyterian church, and from Wilmette; and representatives from neighboring churches.
