KEEPING GARDEN FLOWERS FRESH

INFORMATION IS GIVEN

Floricultural Department of the State University Gives Out Statement Regarding This Operation

How to keep the garden flowers, which are now decorating Illinois home in profusion, fresh for several days was explained by Harry Mohlman a member of the floricultural division of the College of Agriculture, University of Illinois.

"Garden flowers should be plunged into a deep vase of cold water as soon as they are cut and then left in a cool room where there is no draft for an hour," Mohlman said. "This procedure allows the stems and flowers to be filled with water and they can be arranged in bowls, vases or baskets with the assurance that they will be fresh for three or four days, provided they are given a little care each day."

"A wilting flower may be revived in most cases by cutting off about three-fourths of an inch of the stem under water," Mohlman continued. "Holding the stem under water when cutting prevents the air from entering and the stem therefore takes up water more rapidly. All cut flowers, whether they are wilting or not, should have the water on them changed daily and a small piece of the stem cut off under water."

"Flowers grown for cut flowers may be annuals or herbaceous perennials. Annuals are plants that grow from seed, flower, ripen their seed and die during one season's growth. Herbaceous perennials are those forms of hardy plants which dies down to the ground each year but come up again in the spring. They are to remain in one place for several years."

"There are at least 19 annuals and 27 perennials of the better type that are suitable for cut flower use in this state."
