

**ROBBED OF MONEY,
STEAMER TICKET**
**Waukegan Man Led Astray in
Chicago and Passport and

He obtained the booze all right, but when he awoke from his stupor he was lying in a little shed. His pocketbook containing his railroad ticket, steamship ticket, passport and money, was missing.

The fellow made his way back to Chicago and reported the matter to the police of the Maxwell street station. After working on the case a day or two the officers succeeded in locating the pocketbook which contained the two tickets but the passport and the money was gone.
