SHOULD GOVERNMENT OPERATE BUSINESS?

CONTROLLING ALL OR NONE

Communist Plan Scored & Shot to Pieces in Address at Convention of World Advertisers

Bernard J. Mullaney, vice-president of The Peoples Gas Light and Coke company, and former commissioner of public works of the city of Chicago, recently in addressing the Associated Advertising clubs of the world at its London convention said:

"If government ownership of resources and facilities in one basic industry is a good thing, extension of it to include all basic industries must be a good thing. The proponents of government ownership admit this privately, at least—and even assert it. That is, they do when they are both honest and possessed of the reasoning power to expand and apply the signifi-

ficance of their 'logans, and shibboleths.

Can't Discriminate

"Honest belief in government ownership for one form of industry is inseparable from belief in government ownership for other forms of industry; and logical progression from one to another leads inevitably to complete acceptance of the full communist program, as summed up in the dictionary, namely: 'abolition of all private property, and state control of all labor, religion, social relations, etc.'

"There is no middle ground; no stopping half way. Temporary expediency, no matter how alluring, has no place in the consideration of fundamentals. If you are coquetting with the idea of government ownership and operation of super-power or any other industrial detail, you are inviting and should make ready for the consequences that are lurking just around the corner, namely: government ownership and operation of farms, factories, stores, barber shops and beauty parlors; of railroads, street cars, automobiles, bicycles and baby buggies; of books, newspapers, women's clubs; baseball, golf and even your club; of

cooking, bed making, charity balls, churches and children.

No Exceptions

"There are no exceptions in the program for 'abolition of all private property and state control of all labor, religion and social relations.' The comprehensiveness of it is worth pondering."
