PURPLE HALF-BACK WILL NOT RETURN

Walter Banner, Stellar Player For Northwestern, Is Not Returning

Wally Banner, one of the best of Northwestern university's experienced backs, has notified Coach Glenn Thistlethwaite that he will be unable to return this year. The coach on opening his mail after a brief vacation found a letter from Banner, and made the announcement with keen regret, he said. Banner would have been a junior this year. His first year he attended the College of Liberal Arts but in his second year he took up work in Northwestern university dental school and was planning to resume it in the fall as a junior.

He played in nearly all of the big games on the purple schedule last year and did exceptionally good work in the Chicago and Iowa games. In the Chicago game when De Stefano was injured, Wally jumped into his place and impressed the experts with his work as a defensive back. He also starred in the Iowa game. Coach Thistlethwaite's only comment was this: "We shall have to depend more upon our new sophomore squad now that Banner can't return."

Word received from some of the other "old timers" is more encouraging. Capt. Bob Weinecke has seen Coach Thistlethwaite on several occasions lately and is in tiptop form. He is anxious to make this season one of great achievement, he says. Reports from Tim Lowry, the elongated center, also are favorable. Tim who lacked meat last fall has taken on flesh, he writes, and now weighs within two pounds of 200. He is rarin' to get into the old togs. Seidel, end, Red Herman, end, Mathews, A. Kelly and A. Graham also expect to be back in Evanston within a few days.

Irwin Uteritz, all-American quarter of the Michigan 1923 varsity squad, who is to coach the backfield at Northwestern this year, has been heard from and is counting the days until the whistle blows. De Stefano, who was thought as a sure come-back this year, is still working to make up medical studies and the coach is not certain at this time that he will make the grade. RARE ENGRAVINGS GIVEN INSTITUTE

Mr. and Mrs. Potter Palmer Present Art Institute Set of Cards

A set of unique cards, erroneously called playing cards, and known as Tarocchi cards, engraved in Italy in the late 15th century, has just been presented to the Art Institute by Mr. and Mrs. Potter Palmer. They have been assigned to the print department and will prove of much interest to the lovers of rare engravings. Research apparently indicates that this set of cards was originally designed as a pictorial cyclopedia of man, the muses, the arts, the virtues and the planets. But that they were put to extensive use in their time as models and patterns in the workshops and in the studios of craftworkers has also been demonstrated. The set is complete with exception of three missing cards.

TOTAL ECLIPSE OF THE SUN IN 1925

Occurs on January 24, and Will Be Visible in the United States

While no total eclipses of the sun are listed for this year, one of the best opportunities for observing a total shutout of Old Sol's face will be afforded the eastern part of the country early in the coming year, officials at the United States naval observatory, at Washington say.

On Jan. 24, 1925, the sun will be in total eclipse. This will start at sunrise just beyond Lake Superior. Its path will be on into New York state and lower New England. Eastern New York and southern New England will be the best positions for observations.

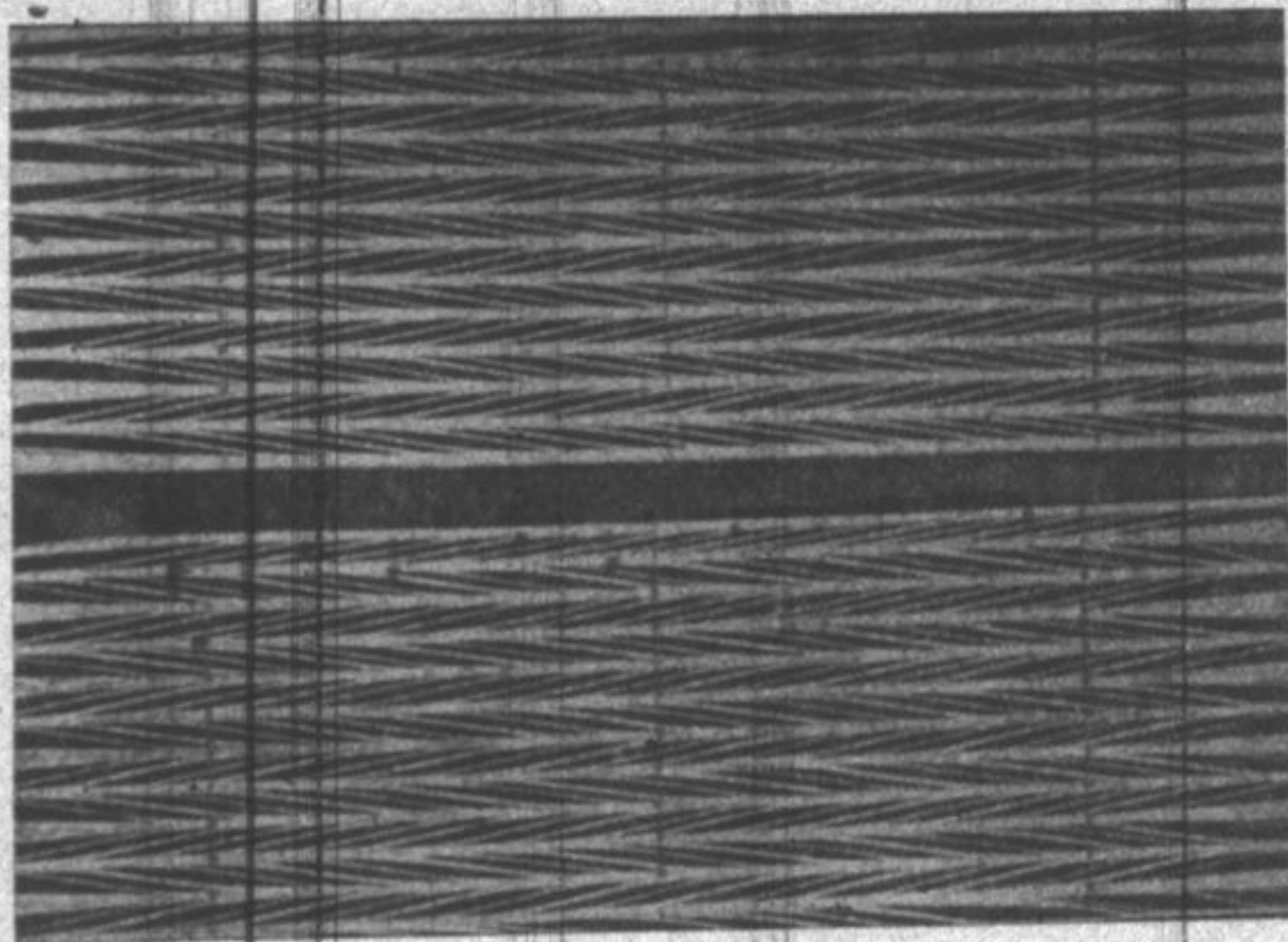

Expanded Wood Lath PROVED STIFFER THAN STANDARD CONSTRUCTION

Comparative tests made by Robert W. Hunt & Co., Engineers

IDENTICAL panels with frames four feet high and eight feet long, constructed with sills and studs 7 1/2 x 3 1/2 in. and studs placed 16 in. on centers, were prepared. FRAME A had one side covered with 3/16 in. dressed sheathing nailed at each stud with 8D nails, and the other side covered with common lath spaced 2 in. on centers and staggered in the usual way.

FRAME B was covered on both sides with Expanded Wood Lath sheets 8 ft. long and 16 in. wide, fastened at the juncture of each rib and stud with 6D nails. In testing these panels the bottom sill was clamped to the base of testing machine and the pull applied to the top sill in the direction of its length.
