The mask of a faun, in bronze, has en placed in the southeast corridor the second floor of the Art Insti-Philpot is best known for his paint ings of portraits and figures, this siece of sculpture is typical of his somewhat whimsical style. It is always the poet at heart who produces the fanciful, imaginative thing, and this delicately modelled mask takes us back to the period of ancient mythology, where deities reigned over the fates of men. The faun was the deity of the fields and greatly rebled the human figure, excepting that its ears were always pointed and stubs of horns grew from each side of the forehead. The most famous of Praxiteles, who lived 350 years benodelled the youthful faun now in the Capitoline Museum in Rome. It was Praxiteles' statue that became the inspiration for Hawthorne's "The Marble Faun."
