WATERWAY BANQUET TO BE ELABORATE

MANY NOTABLE FEATURES

William Hale Thompson Is Host To Middle West Cities At Rainbo Gardens Oct. 6; Entertainment

Guests at the Lake-to-the-Gulf of Mexico Waterway Banquet, which is to be held at the Rainbo Gardens Monday evening, October 6, will witness one of the most attractive shows ever given for banquet participants, according to Fred Mann, owner of the Rainbo Gardens. Mr. Mann has set the wheels into motion, which he says will give the visitors from the territory of the Mississippi Valley all the way from St. Paul to New Orleans an opportunity to see what Chicago really can do in the form of amusement.

Score of Beauties
"Around the Rainbo," is the name of the revue which was staged by Le Roy Prinz, who has made a name for himself as a producer of high-class attractions. More than a score of young Chicago women picked for their pulchritude take part in sixteen numbers, the most important of which are "The Arabian Nights," "Circus Day in Rainbo Land," "The Enchanted Forest," in which the young women who represent trees are transformed into living dryads, Ralph Williams Rainbo Skylarks, who are credited as composing the best dance orchestra in the west, supplying the tunes for the revue and dancing.

Headed by Benda Girl
The list of entertainers is headed by Patricia Gridler, the Benda Girl, who has very recently arrived in this country. Marion Morgan, prima donna and Dorothy Raye, soubrette. It includes Paul Darnelle, Irene Goldman, Esther Kayer, Grace Thayer, Merna Tibbets, Mercedes Kahfield, Bernice Sturtz. The feature of the banquet will be the broadcasting of the speeches. Former Mayor William Hale Thompson, Congressman Henry T. Rainey, and William E. Hull, war-time supporters, are to be the principal orators of the occasion. Although Monday is a silent night in Chicago a special permit has been granted Rainbo Garden station WQJ to broadcast the proceedings of the evening, so stay-at-homes may listen in and hear the banquet oratory and the songs and music.

This banquet is to publicly launch the movement which is to lead to the actual completion of the Illinois waterway that is to connect Chicago with New Orleans.

Huge Amount of Food
The amount of food that will be consumed at the banquet, where 2500 persons recruited from cities between Saint Paul to New Orleans, will be in attendance, would stagger the average housewife. To feed this aggregation of industrial, state and city representatives will require more than a ton of chicken, eighty gallons of soup, 250 cases of peas, 15 cases of tomatoes, 10 cases of lettuce, 50 gallons of vegetables, 25 bushels of potatoes, 100 gallons of coffee and 400 loaves of bread. 100 chefs will prepare the food and a small army of waiters will serve it. Mr. Fred Mann the owner of the Rainbo Gardens, has given orders to his culinary department to make this the best dinner served to such a large aggregation, which will be the biggest banquet ever held in the west.

MASK OF FAUN IS NOTEWORTHY OBJECT

Interesting Work of Art Displayed in Corridor Of The Institute

The mask of a faun, in bronze, has been placed in the southeast corridor on the second floor of the Art Institute. It has been lent by Robert Allerton and is the work of an English artist, Glyn W. Philpot. Although Philpot is best known for his paintings of portraits and figures, this piece of sculpture is typical of his somewhat whimsical style. It is always the poet at heart who produces the fanciful, imaginative thing, and this delicately modelled mask takes us back to the period of ancient mythology, where deities reigned over the fates of men. The faun was the deity of the fields and greatly resembled the human figure, excepting that its ears were always pointed and stubs of horns grew from each side of the forehead. The most famous of the sculptured fauns is that of Praxiteles, who lived 350 years before Christ and whose matchless hand modelled the youthful faun now in the Capitoline Museum in Rome. It was Praxiteles' statue that became the inspiration for Hawthorne's "The Marble Faun."
