Results of Test Actual Movement of Upper Sill Expanded Wood Lath 9.13 9.37

TDENTICAL panels with frames four feet high and eight feet long, constructed with sills and stude 7% x3% in. and stads placed 16 in. on centers, were prepared. FRAME A had one side covered with %x6 in. dressed sheathing nailed at each stud with 8D nails, and the other side covered with common lath spaced 2 in. on centers and staggered in the usual way.
