subdivision, provided that the work is done in accordance with city specifications, under city supervision, and the owner to pay all costs and provide an indemnifying bond in the sum of

Commissioner Cheney moved that the mayor and the city clerk be authorized to enter into agreements with the North Shore line for permission to construct 12-inch iron sewer pans under their tracks in the vicinity of Kincaid avenue and St. Johns avenue, and also near the Northwestern railroad in the same connection. Agreements similar also were authcrized to be made by these officials with the North Shore line regarding laying a sewer under tracks at Marion and St. Johns avenues.

F. B. Thomas was given permission to extend sanitary sewer in Sheridan road from near outlet in the ravine south of Cedar avenue under condition of permit granted Sept. 19, 1924.

Given Leave of Absence On motion of Commissioner Card City Clerk Edward Warren was granted a leave of absence of three months on account of ill health, and the motion expressed the hope of the council for his early recovery.

Mayor Hastings appointed William Flinn Police Officer No. 5 and the appointment was confirmed by the council. His bond, with Fred Schaefer and R. L. Phillips as sureties, was ap-

Commissioner Cheney presented bills and payrolls from Sept. 1 to Oct. 15 and they were approved and ordered paid. The bills totalled \$12,-

On motion of Commissioner Cheney Assistant City Clerk Musser was authorized to sign checks and vouchers in the absence of the clerk.

A resolution offered by Commissioner Cheney was adopted authorizing Commissioner Preston and Auditor Witter to ascertain the compensation paid for engineering services, attorney fees and for spreading assessments in special assessment proceedings by this and other municipalities for the purpose of determining whether compensation paid by this city for this work is on a reasonable basis and not higher than warranted for work being done and in contemplation for the ensuing year.
