**COOLIDGE TO WIN  
IF GOOD VOTE CAST**

**PREDICTION FROM REPORTS**

Careful Survey of Entire Nation Indicates Election of President; Must Get Vote Out

Calvin Coolidge will be the next President of the United States if the people of the United States exercise to the full their right of citizenship and express by ballot their sentiment and their judgment. 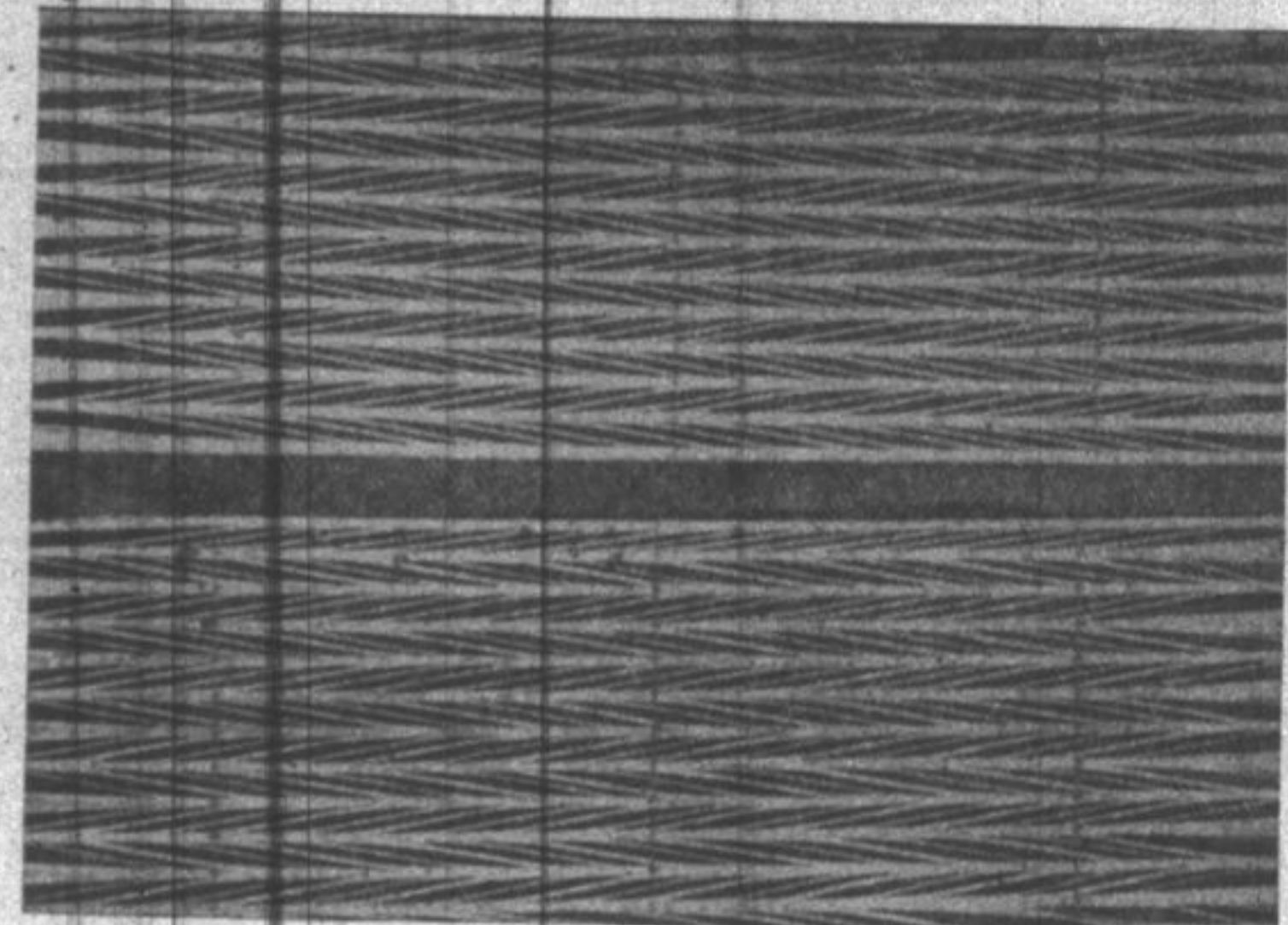

Comparative tests made by Robert W. Hunt & Co., Engineers

**Results of Test**

IDENTICAL panels with frames four feet high and eight feet long, constructed with sills and studs 7 1/2 x 3 1/2 in. and studs placed 16 in. on centers, were prepared.

FRAME A had one side covered with 1/2 x 6 in. dressed sheathing nailed at each stud with 8D nails, and the other side covered with common lath spaced 2 in. on centers and staggered in the usual way.

FRAME B was covered on both sides with Expanded Wood Lath sheets 8 ft. long and 16 in. wide, fastened at the juncture of each rib and stud with 5D nails.

In testing these panels the bottom sill was clamped to the base of testing machine and the pull applied to the top sill in the direction of its length.

Expanded Wood Lath, by this test, has been proven much stiffer than the old standard construction. But added to this advantage are its high insulating qualities and the much lower construction cost when used for either exterior stucco or interior plaster.
