#### **HUGE BEACON FOR** AIR MAIL FLYERS

It and Public Service Co. Supplies the Current For Generator

The post office department has comeleted the installation of a new 500,-000,000 candle power beacon light at the Maywood Air Field-for the guidance of air mail planes after dusk. The Public Service Company supplies the electric energy for it over a special pole line and cable to the base of the 30-foot tower on which the beacon is mounted.

Power is furnished to the light by means of motor generator set. A direct current arc provides the beam of light, Automatic thermostatic controls keep the arc regulated so that the light is always kept constant and

uniform. The purpose of this beacon is to provide a guide marker indicating the location of the air field. It is not used to provide illumination, and the lenses are constructed so that the light is concentrated in a beam and not diffused. The direct beam of light from the beacon is tilted so that it forms an agle 1 degree above the horizontal. As the distance from the light is increased, the spread of the beam is increased.

When a pilot is say 125 miles away, the spread of the beam is nearly two miles, so that if the plane is flying lower than 10,000 feet each time the beacon revolves, the pilot receives a direct flash in his eye. The beacon revolves about once every 40 second, so that the flyer can place the field at once by timing the intervals between the flashes. As the beam is concentrated the flash is strong and sharp.

Supplementing the use of the beacon light is the installation of 56 ground lights, outlining the landing field. After the flyer has spotted the beacon, the ground lights guide him to a safe landing on the cinder

All the above described equipment s an addition to the elaborate lighting installation at this field made by the Public Service Company.

LAKE CO. SCHOOLS GET FINES MONEY

Distribution of Funds from the Sums Collected in Booze Cases; How Divided

T. Arthur Simpson, county superintendent of schools today announced the distribution of \$12,927.80 to the various townships, the distribution representing money received from fines from States Attorney Smith's office. Supt. Simpson's report gives the amount apportioned to the various school districts and as the city of Waukegan is the largest it receives the largest single sum. Waukegan gets \$3,627.10. Others receive sums of from \$1,900 down. By the school census of last June there were 28,004 persons under school age in Lake county. The rate of distribution is 46 cents. 
