## RECALL HISTORY OF ROMANTIC OLD TOWN

GRETNA GREEN, SCOTLAND

Little Town on Border Once Mecca of Elopers From England: Auction Certificates

Something of the romance of Gretna Green, the little Scottish village that for more than 100 years was the haven for couples who, for one reason or another, could not be married in England, was brought to light recently in a London auction room when the original marriage certificates of nearly 1,200 runaway couples, extending over the period of 1825-1854, were sold for \$1,400.

Among the most romantic of the marriages, the certificate of which was among those sold, was that of Prince Carlo Borbone, younger brother of King Ferdinand II, of the Two Sicilies, to Penelope Carolyn Smith, of Waterford, Ireland, in 1836.

Married Four Times  
The couple first lived in Naples and were expelled. They fled to Rome and were married there, but later, upon visiting the bridegroom's sister, the Queen Regent of Spain, found themselves estranged, and were again married at Madrid. When they arrived in England they were advised to go through another ceremony at Gretna Green, and, finally, to placate the hostility of English society, they were married for the fourth time at St. George's, Hanover Square, London.

Another romantic marriage was that of Lady Adela Corisande Maude Villiers, daughter of the Earl of Jersey, who eloped in 1854 with Capt. Charles Parke Ibbetson. It was a coincidence that the bride's grandmother, Miss Sarah Child, daughter of the founder of Child's bank, had also been married at Gretna Green to Lord Westmoreland, and had been pursued by her father, who was only persuaded to give up the chase when one of the horses drawing his coach had been shot by his prospective son-in-law.

More Nobility Involved  
Other runaway marriages brought to light at the sale included that of Ellen Turner, a schoolgirl, to Edward Gibbon Wakefield who was sentenced in 1826 to three years imprisonment for abduction after parliament had by a special act annulled the ceremony; Lady Rose Somerset, daughter of the seventh Earl of Beaufort, to Capt. Francis Lovell, in 1836; Miss Carolyn Clayton to Lord Drumlanrig, afterward seventh Marquess of Queensbury, in 1840.

All the marriages during the period covered were celebrated by John Linton, keeper of the inn at Gretna Green, and it was a descendant of the innkeeper that offered the certificates for sale.

## GOLDEN RULE SUNDAY PROGRAMS BROADCAST

Arrangements Completed For Widespread Radio Service On That Day

In connection with the nation-wide observance of Golden Rule Sunday on December 7, on behalf of the Near East relief, special radio programs are being arranged by practically all the broadcasting stations in the United States.

Every regular Sunday program will feature the observance of the day on December 7, with appropriate music and sermons, and several stations which are ordinarily silent will broadcast special Golden Rule day programs. Two hundred clergymen, the most prominent pulpits orators in America, will preach radio programs for these invisible audiences, using the Golden Rule as a text.

Arrangements for the Golden Rule day broadcasting are being made with the co-operation of Major-General James G. Harbord, president of the Radio Corporation of America, who is one of the national board of trustees of Near East relief. A feature of the musical programs will be the singing of a hymn, "Great Motherland, America," written for the purpose by Professor Theron Hart of Yale and Miss Anna Grannis of Plainville, Conn., copies of which have been furnished to every broadcasting station in America for rendition by quartet. Words and music will also be supplied to the general public and it will be sung in thousands of churches and Sunday schools.

## MOTORISTS SHOULD PLAN FOR WINTER

Urged to Make Preparations for Cold Weather Use of Cars; Warnings Given

Colder weather and a knowledge of what this means to the car owner is the reason for a nation-wide warning to motorists by the American Automobile association, according to Charles M. Hayes, president of the Chicago Motor club, the local affiliation of the national car owner association.

"The great increase in home building locally is viewed as a reason for greater precaution on the part of the car owner during the cold weather season, since private homes mean private garages with all the dangers incident to operating motors in close quarters," Mr. Hayes says.

"In the A. A. A. message car owners are urged to set their carburetors for a richer mixture and to equip their cars with accessories that assist in starting to the end that there may be less need to warm up the motor and thus less temptation to run the engine to the danger point before backing out into the open.

"We also emphasize that A. A. A. warning against using lighted matches for inspecting the level of the radiator contents. Every season alcohol explosions cause serious and sometimes fatal injury that could easily be avoided by a moment's forethought."
