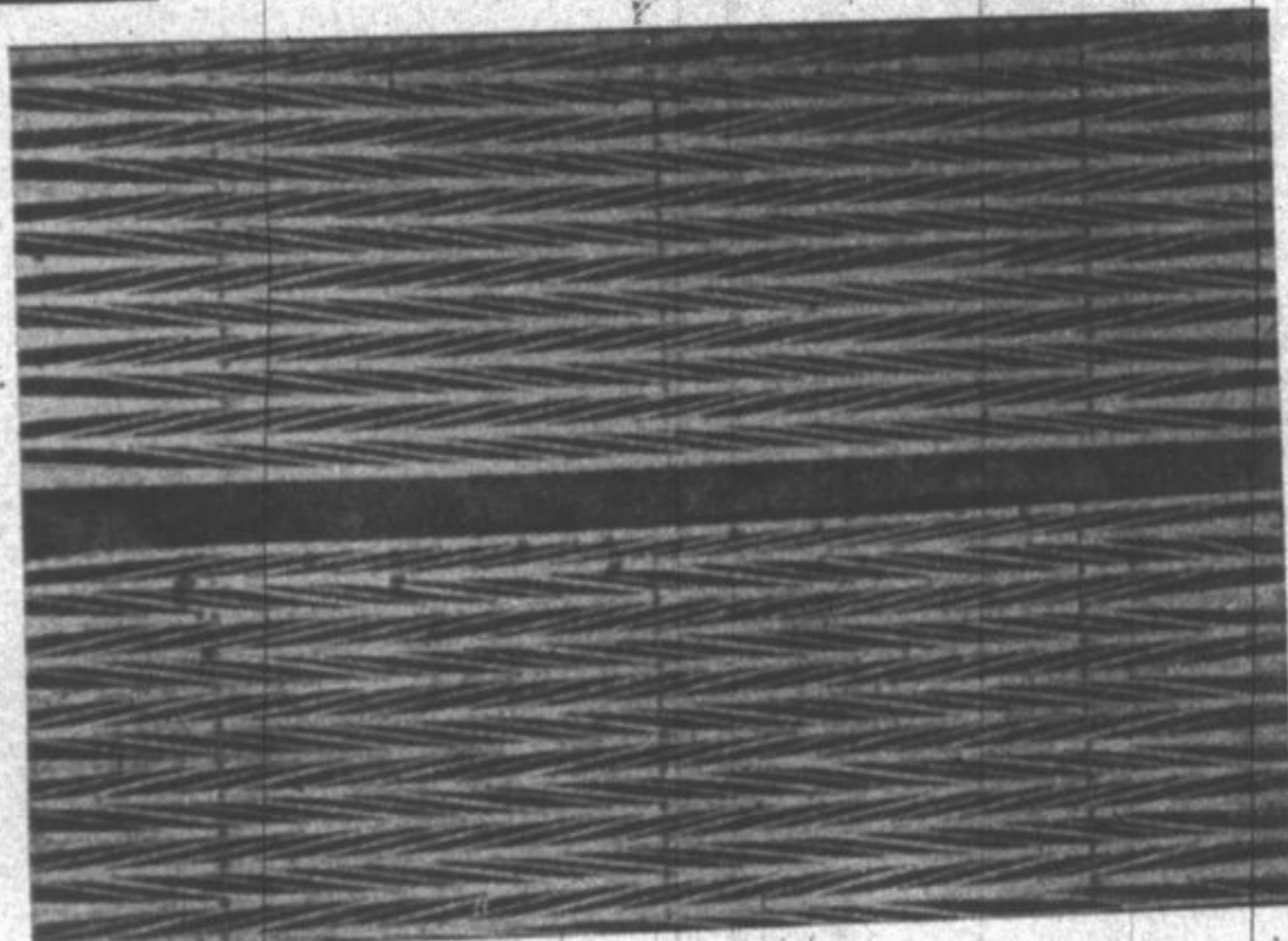

IDENTICAL panels with frames four feet high and eight feet long, constructed with sills and studs 7 1/2 x 3 1/2 in. and studs placed 16 in. on centers, were prepared.
FRAME A had one side covered with 1/2 x 6 in. dressed sheathing nailed at each stud with 8D nails, and the other side covered with common lath spaced 2 in. on centers and staggered in the usual way.
FRAME B was covered on both sides with Expanded Wood Lath sheets 8 ft. long and 16 in. wide, fastened at the juncture of each rib and stud with 8D nails.
In testing these panels the bottom sill was clamped to the base of testing machine and the pull applied to the top sill in the direction of its length.
Expanded Wood Lath, by this test, has been proven much stiffer than the old standard construction. But added to this advantage are its high insulating qualities and the much lower construction cost when used for either exterior stucco or interior plaster.

ECLIPSE OF SUN
ON JANUARY 24TH

VISIBLE NORTH AND EAST
Of Great Interest To Science
As First To Be Seen in
This Country In
Many Years

The eclipse of the sun on January 24th next is explained by Prof. Philip Fox of Dearborn observatory, Northwestern university, as promising great interest to astronomers and of likely general public interest by reason of the opportunities to observe the phenomenon at many points in the United States.
"The eclipse of January 24th, 1925, will see the shadow of the moon first touch the earth at sunrise at a point longitude 94 degrees and 24 minutes and latitude 48 degrees and 18 minutes, or in other words, a point in Northern Minnesota to the northeast of Red Lake," says the Northwestern university professor.

Sweeps East and South
"From there the shadow sweeps east and south across the Great Lakes, across New York, northern Pennsylvania, Connecticut and Rhode Island, and then out over the Atlantic, swinging to the north, and leaves the earth at sunset at longitude 8 degrees five minutes and latitude 61 degrees 28 minutes, a point roughly midway between the Shetland and Faroe Islands.

"The shadow path as it crosses North America is roughly one hundred miles wide. The following points along the central line will sufficiently define the path: Beaver Bay, Minn.; Escanaba, Mich.; Northport, Mich.; Hamilton, Ont.; Buffalo, N. Y.; Binghamton, N. Y.; New Haven, Conn.; Montauk Point. The path, however, is wide enough to include such cities as Duluth, Minn.; Menominee, Manistique and Charlevoix, Michigan; Rochester, N. Y.; Scranton, Pa. On the Hudson river the shadow path reaches from Athens to upper New York city. The last land touched in North America is Nantucket.

In Early Morning
"The hours of total eclipse, as visible in the United States, are all in the early morning: for Michigan, 8:05 in the morning, central standard time; for New York, about 9:10 a. m., Eastern standard time; and for Rhode Island, 9:15 a. m. The region covered by this shadow path is not one which at this time of year and time of day is apt to give clear skies. Expectations as to weather however, are not always realized, for it is to be remembered that California with all her promise and boast of clear skies, turned away empty-handed all groups of astronomers who journeyed there for the eclipse of September, 1923. Astronomers were assured by the natives that it was not clouds that intervened but only 'high fog,' but being fairly well versed in weather and cloud formations, they failed to appreciate the distinction.

At Low Altitude
"Certainly the region of the eclipse path of January, 24 cast do no worse than 'sunny' California and may give brilliant skies. In any case the sun will be at low altitude at such an early morning hour and therefore unfavorably placed for observation. It is of interest, however, to note that the shadow path passes over several established observatories: University of Toronto, Cornell, Vassar college, Yale, Wesleyan, Nantucket Maria Mitchell Association observatory; and complete advantage can be taken by them of all opportunities offered.

"As the shadow path traverses thickly populated country, various arrangements are being made for cooperative observation of certain circumstances of the eclipse, such as the exact location of the edge of the shadow path. These arrangements will enlist the services of all citizens and especially school children.

"The eclipse will not be total for Chicago, but early risers looking toward the rising sun will see about ninety-five per cent of it covered by the intervening moon."
