**FREE DENTAL CLINIC
IS OPENED MONDAY**

Located in H. P. Hospital; Get Services of Dr. Reesch of Evanston

The free dental clinic for school children of Highland Park opened at the Highland Park hospital December first. For several years the dental clinic has been operated at Elm Place school, but was given up last year. During that time the experiment of taking the children in town to the Northwestern Dental school was tried but it was found it took too much time.

The present board of health has absorbed the old Visiting Nurse association and due to their efforts Dr. Reesch of Evanston has been employed to take charge of the clinic. Dr. Reesch has had much experience with this kind of work and Highland Park is fortunate to have obtained his services. The three schools, Deerfield, Lincoln and Elm Place have made appropriations for this work. Also the Woman's Auxiliary of the Highland Park hospital is to contribute for the present until the children's teeth are in order. Due to Miss Williams the clinic was moved to the hospital and is now in a splen-

did room in the basement. A hospital nurse will be in attendance and everything done to make it a success.

It will be remembered that Mr. Julius Rosenwald contributed half of the amount necessary to equip the original dental clinic and all the apparatus is in excellent condition. Nothing is more important to the general health and intelligence than good teeth.

A small charge will be made for those children who can afford to pay, for those who cannot the work will be done for nothing. It is hoped that nearly every one can pay something.

**FARMERS OPEN WAR
UPON COTTONTAILS**

Want Legislation Repealing Closed Season for Rabbits In The State

Fruit growers and farmers in Illinois who have experienced losses the result of rabbits girdling their young fruit trees may, next year, have the privilege of at least "fighting back" if steps taken to have the protective game laws repealed are successful. Farm bureau members from the twenty-fifth congressional district in conference at Marion recently, formally requested the legislature de-

partment of the Illinois Agricultural association to secure a revision of game laws which now protect rabbits by a closed season. A similar request came from fruit growers in Adams county. The Illinois Agricultural association legislative committee will ask the new assembly to discontinue the closed season on rabbits, it is understood.

Sheriff Favors Plan of Illinois Bankers Association; No Compensation
