As might be expected, Mr. Ford has not been restricted by past practice or tendencies in the choice of electrical system and type of motive power unit for the railroad.

Embodies New Ideas The locomotive is not only novel in electrical design, but embodies many new and important ideas in mechanical design. In size it will be prodigious. It will weigh 340 tons, will be 117 feet long, fifteen feet high and ten feet wide. What is more interesting still, it will have sixteen 250 horse power motors connected to sixteen pairs of driving wheels and will be capable of hauling a train of 150 or more loaded box cars.

The engine will not be built for speed, the purpose being to use it for freight service exclusively. Its running speed will be 17 miles an hour and its maximum speed 35 miles an

Carries Convertor Station One of the unique features of this great electric motive unit is that it carries its own convertor station. This eliminates establishment of substations, along the route at present general in railroad electrification. Through a regenerative braking

system the Ford locomotive will have the ability to develop electric energy at any speed from the maximum to practically a standstill. The mechanical parts of the new

locomotive are being designed and built by the Ford Motor company, while the electrical equipment is being built by the Westinghouse Electric & Manufacturing company under Ford supervision and according to Ford specifications.

Another feature of importance is that the trolley voltage adopted for the Detroit & Ironton railroad electrification, is 22,000 volts, 25 cycles, alternating current, a trolley voltage twice as high as any previously used in this country.
