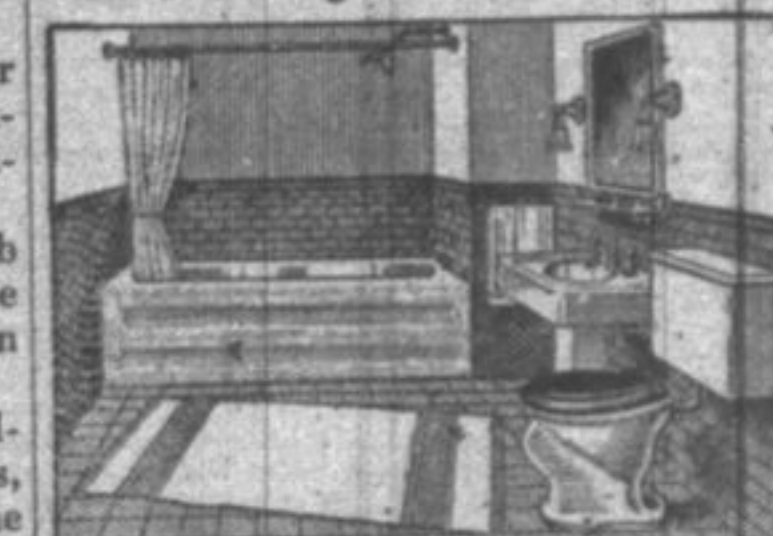

Hoover Issues Standard Code
Washington, D. C.—The Department of Commerce has approved a "people's plumbing code" with the hope that it may be adopted by states and municipalities, it was announced. The bill is for the protection of the public from insanitary plumbing, the use of defective and cheap material and improper installation. The code was prepared by a special committee appointed by Secretary Hoover and headed by William C. Groeniger of Cleveland.
