Honors Dead Heroes

"The other face of the monument. the one to the east, is devoted entirely to the seven citizens of Highland Park who lost their lives in the war. In a medallion at the top is a winged male figure carrying a torch and palm, flying over crosses such as those at Flanders Field. On this face, as on the other, a band of rich design runs down the center of the spaces of granite. Each flank of this monument, flanked by plain, quiet spaces bears part of the inscription, "Forget not Those Who Died in War That You Might Live in Peace."
