AN ORDINANCE
Providing for the issuance of Park Bonds of THE HIGHLAND PARK EAST PARK DISTRICT in the sum of Twenty-Eight Thousand Dollars (\$28,000.00), and Providing for the Payment Thereof.

WHEREAS, The Highland Park East Park District is a duly organized Park District under the laws of the State of Illinois, and is charged with the duty of acquiring and maintaining a public park or parks in said district; and

WHEREAS, said District has now arranged for the purchase of suitable tracts of land for park purposes;

NOW, THEREFORE, for the purpose of providing funds with which to pay the price of such lands,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE HIGHLAND PARK EAST PARK DISTRICT OF LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

Section 1. That there shall be and are hereby directed to be issued twenty-eight (28) Park Bonds of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) each, all to be dated November 1, 1924, all to be bearing interest at the rate of five per cent. (5%) per annum, payable semi-annually, such interest to be evidenced by interest notes or coupons attached to said bonds respectively.

Said bonds to mature in accordance with the following schedule:

21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, and 28	\$1,000.00	Nov. 1, 1928

Both principal and interest of said bonds shall be payable at The Highland Park State Bank, Highland Park, Illinois. Said bonds shall be signed by the President and Treasurer of the Board of Park Commissioners and countersigned by its Secretary, with his seal of office affixed.

Section 2. Except as to number and date of maturity, said bonds and coupons shall be in substantially the following forms:

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That The Highland Park East Park District, in the County of Lake and State of Illinois, a park district legally organized and existing under the laws of the State of Illinois, acknowledges itself to owe, and for value received hereby promises to pay to bearer, One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) lawful money of the United States, on the first day of November, 19... with interest thereon from the date hereof at the rate of five (5) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually on the first day of May and November in each year, on presentation and surrender of the annexed interest coupons as they severally become due. Both the principal and interest of this bond are hereby made payable at The Highland Park State Bank, Highland Park, Illinois.

This bond is one of a series of bonds of like date and tenor, except as to denomination and date of maturity, issued for the purpose of providing funds for the acquisition of public park sites under the authority of an Act of the General Assembly of the State of Illinois entitled "An Act to provide for the organization of park districts and the transfer of submerged lands to those bordering on navigable bodies of waters," approved June 24, 1895, and the several amendments thereof.

And it is hereby certified and recited that all acts, conditions, and things required to be done precedent to and in the organization of The Highland Park East Park District and in the issuing of this bond have been done, happened, and been performed in regular and due form and season as required by law; that a continuing direct annual tax has been levied upon all the taxable property in said The Highland Park East Park District for the payment of the principal and interest of this bond; and that the total indebtedness of said The Highland Park East Park District, this bond included, does not

exceed any constitutional or statutory limitations.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF The Highland Park East Park District, acting by its Board of Commissioners, has caused this bond to be signed by the President and Treasurer and attested and countersigned by the Secretary of its Board of Park Commissioners, with his seal of office affixed, and has caused the annexed interest coupons to be executed with the lithographed fac-simile of said officers, this first day of November, 1924.

The Highland Park East Park District promises to pay to bearer Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) at the Highland Park State Bank, Highland Park, Illinois, being semi-annual interest due on that date on its Park Bond dated November 1, 1924, Number _____.

Section 3. That for the purpose of providing for the payment of principal and interest of said bonds as same become due and payable, there shall be and there is hereby levied a continuing direct annual tax upon all the taxable property in The Highland Park East Park District sufficient to produce the following sums for the following years, respectively:

1926	650.00	10,000.00	10,650.00
1927	200.00	8,000.00	8,200.00

Provision to meet the requirements of this Section shall be made in apt time and manner in the annual appropriation bill.

Section 4. WHEREAS the tax levied in time to pay the interest accrued for the year 1925 will not be col-

lected on said bonds, and evidenced by interest coupons Numbers 1 maturing on the first day of May 1925, Numbers 2 maturing on the first day of November, 1925, Numbers 3 maturing on the first day of May, 1926, Numbers 4 maturing on the first day of November, 1926, and Numbers 5 maturing on the first day of May, 1927, there shall be and is hereby appropriated out of the funds of this District not otherwise appropriated, the sum of One Thousand Four Hundred and No 100 (1400.00) Dollars or as much thereof as may be necessary to pay said coupons.

Section 5. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.
