Circulating tank water heater. 25 feet of double copper coil.

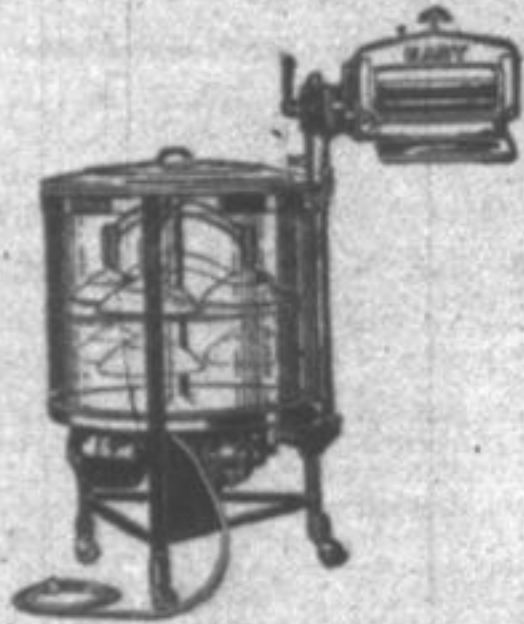

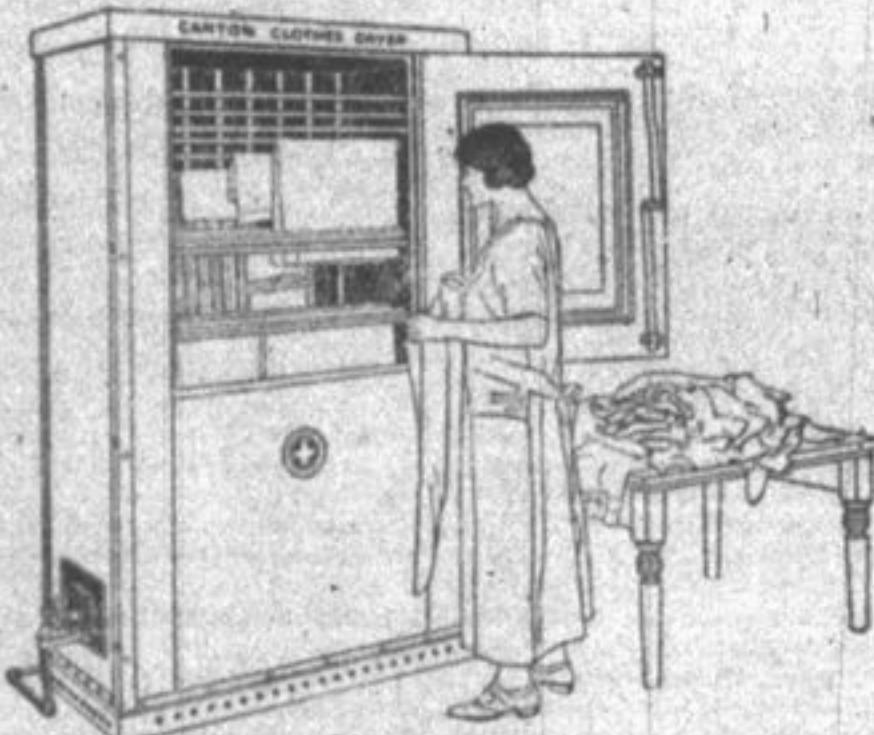

## SCARLET FEVER IS LEADING CONTAGION

325 CASES ARE REPORTED

Increase at This Time Expected; Health Director of State Urges Control Measures in Illinois

Right now scarlet fever is the most prevalent but one of the notifiable diseases in Illinois, according to state health authorities. The exception is chickenpox. Last week 325 cases of scarlet fever were reported. Two months ago the weekly average was only 100.

"An increase in scarlet fever at this time of year is seasonal and is expected" said Dr. Isaac D. Rawlings, state health director, "but case reports now running 75 per week above those of last year. Furthermore, January is nearly always the month of the highest prevalence in this state with February and March almost as high. Accordingly no significant drop in scarlet fever incidence is anticipated prior to April.

"Scarlet fever can be controlled and it can be prevented if proper steps are taken promptly and vigorously. The chief control measures for communities are:

1. Medical inspection of school children.
2. Strict supervision over unpasteurized milk supplies.
3. Quarantine of all known and suspected cases.

"School children in the grades bear the brunt of all scarlet fever since it attacks most frequently those between 5 and 12 years of age. The children spread it from one to another through personal contact. Some cases are so mild that without medical inspection the patient continues in school but severe cases may result from exposure to mild ones. Not only this but the most contagious stage of the disease is during the first week. These facts explain why the daily inspection of school children is highly important in communities where scarlet fever appears. The inspections should be done by physicians and nurses. Where health departments have not the personnel to carry out such work a temporary staff should be employed. Schools should not be closed because such action prevents the close medical supervision and control of the children which is imperative in preventing the spread of scarlet fever. Prompt and sufficient inspection in the schools will prevent scores of cases in any community and will save not a few lives.

"Scarlet fever may very readily be spread through unpasteurized milk. It is therefore important to see that all contact between scarlet fever patients and milk handlers be avoided. The sale of milk from premises on which scarlet fever exists or the handling of milk by persons in whose family the disease exists should not be tolerated.

"Parents who have the interest of their own and other children at heart should never allow a sick child to go to school. Sore throats, vomiting, fever and headache are symptoms that mean either scarlet fever or diphtheria and children so affected ought not only to be kept out of school but they should be confined to bed and receive prompt medical service.

"Minimum quarantine for scarlet fever is 28 days. The 325 cases reported last week will therefore spend 9100 days in quarantine—a total of 25 full years. This, together with the dangers of complications that sometimes pursue the victims throughout life suggest the importance of preventing scarlet fever."
