

LOCAL TAX RATE IS LESS; OTHERS MORE

INCREASES IN THE COUNTY

Considerable Boosts Are Seen in Many Districts; Comparative Figures Given For Two Years

With only a few exceptions the tax rate for the various cities and villages in the county were materially increased for 1924, according to the figures completed today by the county clerk. Highland Park districts are among the few to show a decrease.

The total county value for 1923 was \$48,299,407 while for 1924 it was \$49,407,417.

The county rate includes the detention home and county highway rate which is .64 cents for both years, and the county bond rate which was .36 cents for 1923, and .33 for 1924.

The Highland Park districts have a lower rate this year, it is explained that there is no road and bridge, no town tax or city bond rate.

Libertyville's rate (school district No. 70) jumped from \$8.22 to \$10.01 per each \$100 assessed value, while Lake Villa district No. 32 went from \$6.48 to \$9.03, or an increase of \$2.55 the largest percentage of increase in any district in the county.

The bill is for the protection of the public "from insanitary plumbing, the use of defective and cheap material and improper installation." The code was prepared by a special committee appointed by Secretary Hoover and headed by William C. Groeniger of Cleveland.

APPLE GROWERS USE OILED PAPER WRAPS

The use of oiled paper wrappers, developed recently by the Bureau of Plant Industry, United States Department of Agriculture, to control scald in boxed apples, has now become common among apple growers. These wrappers have not controlled apple scald completely, but they have caused such a marked reduction in this trouble that the trade recognizes them as an essential part of the industry.

Another method of using oiled paper developed by the department is in the shredded form for the prevention of scald in barreled apples. Paper in this form was tried out for some time experimentally and last year a number of commercial growers in the East used it to a small extent. It has been found that one and one-half pounds of the shredded, oiled paper, well distributed through the barrel, produces fairly satisfactory results.

MAKES NEW RECORD IN USING TIMBER

Utilizes Hemlock Logs So Small That Seventy-Seven Loaded Upon One Car

A pulp and paper company operating in the lower Columbia river region recently set a new record of timber utilization by using hemlock logs so small that 77 could be loaded on one logging car, reports T. T. Munger of the Pacific Northwest Forest Experiment station.

This record was made in the course of relogging a forest that not long ago had all the timber taken out that could be profitably handled with big donkey and high-load station. The company is now getting some 10,000 feet per acre additional with a Lidgerwood skyline skidder capable of bringing in the little hemlock trees, tops, and small pieces of spruce, as many as six at a time with this rigging. These are loaded on especially constructed cars accommodating usually 30 to 35 pieces per car. That in at least one instance 77 hemlock logs were loaded shows how small many of them were. Indeed, small logs even down to four inches in the ton are being taken.

Rafted down to the mill, this material makes as good paper as the larger timber—in some particulars better, say the paper makers. At the same time the relogged area is being left in admirable shape from a fire-protection standpoint. This, according to the foresters, is good fire protection, good conservation, and good forestry.
