RABBIT SEASON IS NOT EXTENDED NOW

Game Warden Stratton Denies Report to That Effect. Widely Printed

Springfield, Ill. Dec. 30, 1924.

Many inquiries have been received by the division of game and fish relative to an extension of the open season on rabbit shooting and newspaper generally have published an article stating that the season had been extended. This statement is wholly unauthorized by the division of game and fish and will no doubt cause great embarrassment to hunters, sportsmen and commercial houses all over the state.

The question of an extension of the season for taking rabbits was submitted to Attorney General Brundage who stated that the division was not authorized to make the same as the season was established by an act of the legislature and could not be changed except by the act of the general assembly.

The game code specifies that the open season for taking rabbits in the northern zone shall close on January 31, and in the central southern zones on January 1.
