The sweet corn pack in this state finds its counterpart in the national pack for the year. Total production in 1924 was over twelve million cases as compared with the fourteen million cases of the year before. This year's production, however, is about a million cases above the pack of 1922. The violent fluctuation from year to year has been characteristic in the corn industry, so that the 15,-000,000 cases which were produced in 1920 dropped the very next year to scarcely half that figure.
