SCHOLARSHIPS FOR PRACTICING THRIFT

Wesley Barry, Movie Boy Star To Offer Opportunities To Saving Youth

To the ten high school boys in the United States who show the best records for thrift, as disclosed by savings bank deposits, and whose classroom grades are exceptionally high there will go during the next decade as many free scholarships in Northwestern university, the gift of Wesley Barry, famous screen star. The announcement, made by President Walter Dill Scott recently, also indicated that the gifted youngster from Hollywood whose early days were difficult and whose education has been obtained against trying obstacles, has interested himself in a national thrift movement with which many of the leading banks of the country are co-operating.

Wesley Barry's gift to Northwestern, an initial one which may lead to more interesting developments, at this time amounts to \$10,000. The annual tuition at that university is \$225 but the donor, who has just turned seventeen years, is so wholeheartedly behind the plan to teach thrift to American lads, that he wants to see each and every prize-winning student entirely through the college course and so has guaranteed a scholarship for all of the four university years. The plan at present is to start a Wesley Barry scholarship at Northwestern in September, 1925, with the opening of the new college term and to continue to practice for at least a decade.

MANY ORCHARDS IN STATE DISAPPEAR

Number of Small Ones Greatly Lessened in Illinois In Last Ten Years

More than half of the farm orchards in Illinois have disappeared within the last ten years as a result of the toll taken by fruit diseases, insects and general neglect, according to members of the horticultural department of the college of agriculture, University of Illinois. How to check these ravages and put the small orchard back on a paying basis where it will furnish the farmer and his family with the fruit they need is becoming a more pressing problem every year. One step toward solving the problem has been taken by placing orcharding problems, along with gardening and other related ones, in a prominent place on the program for the annual farmer's week to be held at the college, January 12 to 16. The whole of the Wednesday morning

session, January 14, will be given over to fruit growing and gardening subjects.

The question of what shall be done with the farm orchard will be answered by W. S. Brock, horticultural extension specialist of the college, in the first of a series of talks. He will outline a program of pruning, spraying and management designed to keep the small orchard on a profitable basis. Bacterial shot hole, one of the worst peach diseases, will be discussed by H. W. Anderson, assistant chief of pomological pathology at the college. Some of the more important diseases which are proving to be limiting factors in the profitable production of small fruits will be taken up and discussed in detail by A. S. Colby, associate chief of pomology at the college.

SWEET CORN PACK REDUCED IN 1924

Is Half-Million Cases Less In Last Year Than In 1923, Report Says

The sweet corn pack of Illinois for 1924 is 500,000 cases under that of the previous year, according to the Sears-Roebuck agricultural foundation. The total pack this year is 2,310,000 cases as compared to 2,833,000 cases the year before, while the 1922 pack was somewhat less than two million cases, the foundation states.

The sweet corn pack in this state finds its counterpart in the national pack for the year. Total production in 1924 was over twelve million cases as compared with the fourteen million cases of the year before. This year's production, however, is about a million cases above the pack of 1922. The violent fluctuation from year to year has been characteristic in the corn industry, so that the 15,000,000 cases which were produced in 1920 dropped the very next year to scarcely half that figure. Although 14 million cases were produced as far back as 1911, two years later found that production cut in two, with the result that steady prices would be impossible but for common practice of carrying heavy stocks over from one season to the next.

The fluctuation in production is not only shown in the country as a whole but individual states fluctuate sharply in opposite directions the same year, the figures compiled by the foundation show. Ohio came only about half as much corn this year as last, while Maine increased her output about one-third. Maine, New York and Minnesota were the only states to show material increases this year, Iowa, Illinois and Maryland dropping off 20 to 25 per cent each while still dividing honors fairly for leading place.

Its Virtues as Such Attested In Report of Near East Relief Workers

The virtues of Mount Olympus—where the Greek gods once made their headquarters—as a health resort, are attested in a report made by the medical department of Near East relief. The report shows that out of 650 child tuberculosis patients in the American orphanage hospitals in Greece, 75 percent have been cured during the past year through intensive care in the rarified air and sunlight of the Greek mountains.
