CHICAGO MAIL MAN HERO OF WORLD WAR

JOHN FRANCISCO VETERAN Delivers Letters to Gold Coast Homes and Is Interested in Legion Campaign For Funds

John Francisco delivers mail to that section of the Gold Coast where Harold F. McCormick, Mrs. John Alden Carpenter, Mrs. Joseph G. Coleman and others live.

It is doubtful if any of them know that the smiling young postman who brings their letters is one of the greatest heroes of the World War. They would not learn anything about it from him. Nevertheless he has a remarkable citation for the distinguished service cross presented to him by General Pershing.

Gains Citation
In the terrific fighting in the Bois de Foret October 12, 1918, Francisco, then a private, 182nd Infantry, thirty-third division, displayed remarkable heroism and leadership (so runs the general order covering his case). During the afternoon the enemy made three strong counter attacks and during these attacks Private Francisco gathered together fragments of squads and assumed command of them. He led them against the enemy, approaching from the rear of the right flank, and was personally responsible for the capture of four machine guns and five prisoners.

Francisco is a member of the Combat Medal Men's association. One of the requirements for admission to that organization is that an applicant shall belong to the American Legion. Francisco is in Blackhawk Post No. 107.

He is intensely interested in the American Legion endowment fund of which President Calvin Coolidge is the honorary chairman. Although he carries a disability rating he wants nothing for himself. He owns his home and has a thriving family. But he does want his less fortunate buddies properly cared for and he is concerned about the welfare of veterans' orphans.

Leaders in City Drive
Assisting State Chairman Charles W. Folds and City Chairman George W. Rossetter in perfecting the Chicago organization for the drive are Brig. General Charles G. Dawes, vice president elect; department commander Howard P. Savage; Colonel A. A. Sprague, general Abel Davis, Harold F. McCormick, Victor Lawson, Mrs. Edward Hines, Col. Roy D. Keehn, Eugene J. Buffington, Edward J. Doyle and a committee of forty prominent business men and women leaders.

The Chicago quota of \$400,000 has been divided among thirty-six industrial divisions. Each division has a chairman and a committee which will receive the contributions from the business organizations in its group. Chairman Rossetter expects to have the Cook county quota raised by March 15th. Melvin A. Traylor, president of the First National bank, is treasurer of the fund.

Defeated by Harrison Tech But Make Splendid Showing in Events

The 1925 high school swimming season was brought to a close last Friday night by a hotly contested fray with the marine aggregation from Harrison Tech of Chicago. But in spite of the unusually large crowd in the local aquarium to help the boys in their final start, Deerfield was defeated in both classes.

Captain Wally Bieger, in his last showing for Deerfield, before graduation, made a splendid showing in the dives, copping a first in that event, while Turpin, another last year man, took second. Other seniors who took honors were Bob Spellman in the backstroke, Ray Spellman in the plunge and Jim Robbins in the two free style events. Harrison's premier crawler traversed the 100-yard crawl in 1 minute, 1 1/2 seconds, the fastest time for that distance ever made in our pool.

The junior section contained some pretty races, among which was the 40 yard crawl, negotiated by a Harrison man in 22 seconds. Our minors lost their final race, the relay. Upon the senior relay, the outcome of that meet depended. This event the Harrisonians won by some remarkable splashing, thereby gaining a hard-earned victory.
