Local High School Runners Make Good Showing in Chicago Last Saturday

Saturday afternoon the Deerfield-Shields track teams journeyed to Bartlett gym, where they competed in the annual indoor suburban league meet. The seniors made a very creditable showing with 9 3-4 points while the juniors were able to annex 1 1-3 points. The majors owe their points to "Herc" Robbins, "Bob" Laird, Harvey Cain, and the "Dave" Greene. Herc placed first in the shot put with a magnificent heave of 44 feet 10 inches. Bob Laird and Harvey Cain finished third in the mile and quarter mile runs respectively. Dave tied for third in the pole vault. The juniors owe their 1 1-3 markers to Jack Zengeler and Junior Cope. Zengeler placed fourth in the 110-yd. run while Junior tied with two other leapers for fourth position in the high jump.

The meet marked the initial performance of "Tillie" Martin, better known to basketball fans than track followers, who competed in the half mile run and made a very good showing, finishing just out of the select four. This being his first race, great things are expected from him in the future.

ELGIN WINS SECTION TOURNEY AT JOLIET

In the sectional tournament of the Illinois High School Basketball association, played last week-end at Joliet, for this section, the Elgin school team won, defeating Freeport, 10 to 9. Waukegan, which won the district meet at Deerfield-Shields, lost to Elgin, 16 to 14, in the sectional meet.

The following were the results of the four Illinois sectional tournament title games in Joliet, Peoria, Centralia and Springfield Saturday night: Elgin 10, Freeport 9 at Joliet; Canton 15, Peoria 14 at Peoria; Marion 18, Mt. Vernon 17, at Centralia; and Champaign 22, Athens 20 in an overtime game at Springfield. The preliminary games of the state finals will be played at Urbana Friday night and the winners will play Saturday night for the championship while the losers of Friday's games will play for third place. The four teams in the state meet are Elgin, Canton, Marion and Champaign.

Nurmi Breaks All Records and Is Fleeter Than Fabled Couriers of Old

A Finnish go-getter has been in our midst.
