NURSERY SCHOOL PART OF SYSTEM

Experiment is Success at Highland Park, Mich.; Children Cared For

A nursery school is operated in connection with the public-school system of Highland Park, Mich. It accommodates 15 children from 21/2 to 41/2 years old. A full-time housekeeper is employed, a school nurse makes daily visits, and the work is under the supervision of a trained housearts instructor. Upper-grade high school girls in relays assist in the care of the children, and 120 each week will receive the benefits of the nursery as a laboratory.

Food for the children is prepared in the school kitchen. Copies of menus, with special food suggestions, are sent to the mothers. A normal life is led in the nursery, the children being alowled to work, play, or sleep as they desire, and in a surprisingly short time they become self-reliant and thoughtful of others. While the nursery is of real value to the children and the mothers, its main purpose is to give practical training in child care to high school girls of the upper grades.
