Dr. Pease of Mt. Wilson Discov ers Mira, Second Largest Star in Universe

The following is a clipping from the Los Angeles Times of March 9th, showing the achievement of Dr. Francis G. Pease of Mt. Wilson Observatory. Dr. Pease is a former Highland Park resident.

Pasadena, March 9 .- Announcement that the variable star Mira, s faint speck in the sky 165 light-years away, probably is the second largest known star in the universe was made at Mount Wilson Observatory today.

The astonishing discovery that Mira is 250,000,000 miles in diameter and is thus 25 per cent largest that Betelguese, the big star of the constellation Orion, was made by Dr. Francis G.
