ASK MOTORISTS TO TEST SAFETY SIGNS
MOTOR CLUB STARTS MOVE
 Drivers Requested to Report On Efficacy of Warning Devices on Highways Of State

Local motorists are to be asked to co-operate with the American Automobile association in a test in the interests of greater safety in night driving, according to a bulletin issued by the accident prevention department of the Chicago Motor club.
 There is said to be urgent need for some means of marking barriers across closed roads so that night drivers will be spared the many accidents, and near accidents, which are being reported to the A. A. A. national headquarters in Washington, D. C., and it is believed that the automobile driver is in the best position to decide upon some method that could be standardized.

Marking Most Noticeable
 "What method of marking road construction barriers engages your attention quickest when you are proceeding along what you believe to be an unobstructed road at night?" asks the bulletin. "Whatever warning engages your attention first is the safest."
 "Bear in mind that red lanterns are barred from the list of possibilities, since they are very readily stolen and depend for their proper operation upon a human element. Somebody must attend to them if they are to be effective as a safety measure, and it is just this human element that opens up possibilities of trouble."

Other Devices
 "Some highway departments are being urged to repaint their barriers across roads under construction, and to white markings on the roadway itself as an extra precaution. Markings similar to that used by many localities to designate dangerous crossings are also being suggested. Many of the devices used to reflect the auto headlights rays, it is believed, should be used in addition to other warnings."
 "If you have an idea let us have it, and we will pass it along to A. A. A. headquarters."

WOMEN'S SHOES TOO SMALL FOR REFUGEES
 Relief Workers in Greece Can't Use Them; Only Children Can Wear Them

American women are asked not to give their old shoes to the Greek refugees. American women's feet are too small.
 A statement from H. C. Jaquith, director of the Near East Relief in Greece, says: "Until the women of America change their styles in footwear, refugee women in the Near East cannot use them. The American slipper will not fit the refugee Cinderella."
 "Most refugee women whom we have supplied with old shoes collected in America require fairly large men's sizes. This is partly because their feet are naturally larger, and partly because they are forced for the greater part of the year to go barefoot or with home-made footwear which develops large feet. Fifty-five percent of the old shoes received this winter from America have been women's sizes, which can be used only for very small children."

ILLEGAL TO SELL BONUS CERTIFICATE
 So Veterans Bureau Decides; Rights to Compensation Not Transferable

It is illegal to sell Federal Soldier's Bonus Certificates, the Veteran's bureau ruled recently.
 Last November the bureau held that persons, for a valuable consideration could be made beneficiaries but Director Frank T. Hines today overruled the earlier decision and held that the rights to the adjusted compensation cannot be sold. Reports have been reaching Washington from many places that veterans were offering their certificates to the highest bidder and in some cases the Veterans bureau has been asked to redeem the papers. Under the decision all such transactions are illegal.

DEERFIELD STUDENT WINS HONORS AT U.

Virginia Supple, of the Deerfield-Shields high school, class of 1924, who is majoring in physical education has won several honors at the University of Illinois. She was a member of the varsity hockey team; won the women's tennis championship of the university; and was captain of the freshman basketball team.

For Saving a Life
 "THE heroism of the commonplace"—what can fittingly reward those acts of bravery performed, often at the risk of life, by employees in the line of duty?
 The North Shore Line has caused to be struck a gold First Aid Medal, awarded each North Shore employee instrumental in saving a human life.
