Happenings About This Section Of North Shore and Vicinity; Waukegan and County Seat

Inspired by the American flag that stood before them, 44 naturalized citizens took the oath of allegiance last week in the circuit court room, Waukegan, at patriotic exercises held by the American Legion.

The County convention of Woodmen this afternoon elected these delegates to attend the state convention at Centralia, May 6: Charles Crabtree, Waukegan; W. Danner, Highland Park; Joe Sherman, Grayslake; G. Shafer, Lake Forest.

A thorough inspection of all business buildings in Waukegan, including the schools and churches, will occur on May 15, according to an announcement made last week. It is expected that the inspection will be made by a total of 45 field men of the Illinois State Fire Marshal Prevention association.

Jack Johnson, negro pugilist, who was arrested in Waukegan two weeks ago on a charge of speeding, failed to appear in police court when his case was called and the \$10 cash bond that he put up was forfeited.

Walter Marlatt, editor of the Kenosha News and one of the best known newspaper men in Wisconsin, died last week at his home, aged 51. He has been ailing for some time with heart trouble but had made daily trips to his office in a car.

DUMP 10 MILLION TROUT INTO LAKE

State Fish and Game Department Busy Restocking Lake Near Waukegan

The lake shore down at the fish docks in Waukegan was a scene of busy activity one day last week, when the representatives of the state Fish and Game department from Waukegan started restocking Lake Michigan with lake trout.

Five million fingerlings were dumped into the lake yesterday afternoon and five million more will be received for stocking the lake here within the next few days. The lake trout are only for commercial fishing but stocks of other fish than can be caught by sportsmen from the pier and from small boats will be planted here this spring.

The fish being planted here this year were raised at the new state fish hatcheries at Spring Grove, Ill., and are being shipped in to Waukegan by the truck load. Experts declare that the tiny fish are in fine condition and they are expected to be a great benefit to Waukegan residents.

The spawn from which these trout were hatched were taken from the lake off Waukegan last fall, being shipped from here to the hatchery.
