Advertising is well worth while, as it assists in the development of largescale production and regional specialization; it renders sales efforts more leffective and more economical and helps to individualize products,-but much of our American advertising is ineffective, claims Prof. Fred E Clark, professor of marketing at vertising."

Passing over the favorable statement, which is generally acknowledged in the business world, and coming to Prof. Clark's fourth and last contention, it is discovered that there is strictly good and bad advertising still existent in the United States.
