WORKING ADEQUATELY

Figures Issued at Washington **Indicate Collections Are** Satisfactory

Figures just given out at Washngton covering the tax collections for the first eight months of the fiscal year indicate that the new rates are working satisfactorily and that the collections are exceeding the earlier estimates. It is now predicted that at the close of the fiscal year June 30, there will be a budget surplus of at least \$100,000,000.

The returns to date coupled with careful estimates of what will be collected between now and July first indicate that the total collections for ters to secure qualified coaches from the fiscal year will be \$1,671,123,104 income taxes, and it is generally believed that the actual taxes collected will be in excess of that sum.

The treasury experts had believed that with the improvement in business bringing in larger returns, and in the cutting down of governmental expenses there would be a surplus \$374,000,000 in the treasury June 30, 1926. But they are beginning to think now that this estimate is too low, and that unless there is a business depression in the meantime, the surplus may well amount to a half billion dollars.
