AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE SALARY OF CERTAIN EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK:

SECTION 1.—That the salaries of the following employees, for the fiscal year beginning May 1st, 1925, and ending April 30th, 1926, be fixed at such sum as is provided for by this ordinance for such employee for the discharge of the duties of such office, as required under the laws of the State of Illinois, and the ordinances of the City of Highland Park, during the term of his employment, and that such employee shall receive no further compensation from the City of Highland Park for the duties of such office during the term thereof.

That the salary of Firemen Number One and Two be and it is hereby fixed at the sum of One Thousand Six Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$1,680.00) per annum.

That the salary of Fireman Number Three be and it is hereby fixed at the sum of One Thousand Five Hundred Sixty Dollars (\$1,560.00) per annum.

SECTION 2.—That the salaries provided for in Section One of this ordinance shall be due and payable in semi-monthly installments on the First and Fifteenth days of each month for the preceding half month of their services during the term of their office.

SECTION 3.—That the salary of Firemen Number One, Two and Number Three shall be paid from the Salary Fund provided for in the Department of Public Health and Safety.

SECTION 4.—That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5.—This ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication.
