## "MILLION DOLLAR" MEETING OF BOARD

Ravinia court pavement, estimate, \$13,555.95; bids—Western Improvement Co., \$10,059.15; Paul Reschke, \$11,219.25; Charles Burkitt & Co., \$11,476.80; H. G. Goelitz Co., \$13,859.75; E. A. Meyers Construction Co., \$12,227.20; Highways Construction Co., \$12,343.25; Chicago Heights Coal Co., \$10,384.75.

Brasies subdivision paving; estimate, \$110,504.00; bids—Western Improvement Co., \$86,731.75; H. G. Goelitz Co., \$107,179.00; E. A. Meyers Construction Co., \$101,020.35; Highways Construction Co., \$91,349.65; Chicago Heights Coal Co., \$86,642.35; John A. McGarry Co., \$98,805.93.

In each of these big jobs the price of the lowest bidder and some others are below the engineers' estimate, indicating that the city is going to get much pavement work done this year at lower cost than has heretofore been the case for work of this kind.

At this meeting a public hearing was held on another big job, the widening and paving of Central avenue east 300 feet and the widening and paving of Sheridan road from Central to Park avenue, the total estimated cost of which combined contract is close to \$60,000.

Two Huge Contracts  
Two huge local improvements were originated, one for paving streets in Ravinia Forest and Northwood manor subdivisions at a total estimated cost of \$304,000, and the other for the construction of trunk line water mains in the territory recently annexed to the city, at an estimated cost of \$395,000.

A resolution also was adopted calling for bids for the contract of paving the streets in Hill & Stone's Ravine View subdivision. The bids will be opened July 10; the cost is estimated at about \$51,000.

The board adopted resolutions accepting completed North Green Bay road sewer system from the Highways Construction Co., the total cost being \$59,686.00, and also the completed southeast system of sanitary sewers from the Charles M. Porter Co., the total cost being \$131,151.00.

Council Meets  
At the session of the city council Commissioner Cheney presented bills and payrolls May 15 to June 15, which were allowed. The bills totaled \$16,929.70.

On motion of Commissioner Cheney the appropriation ordinance, which is pending, was amended by adding to the appropriation for the department of public health and safety an item of \$1,500 for examination, cleaning and repairing of the water intake pipe; also that appropriation for lighting the business district in the department of public property be increased from \$1,420 to \$1,820 and that under miscellaneous appropriations the appropriation to meet expenses of the board of local improvements be increased from \$25,000 to \$20,000. The appropriation ordinance is to remain on file in the city clerk's office for public inspection, complete in form, until final passage.

Commissioner Card moved that Commissioner Gourley have charge of the public bathing beach in the absence of Commissioner Preston.  
Commissioner Cheney moved acceptance of the plat showing area to be dis-annexed from the city and annexed to Deerfield village. Tentative approval of plats of subdivision submitted by Geo. F. Nixon Co. was accorded, on another motion by Cheney.

Commissioner Card moved that Baird & Warner's offer to plant flowers in urns on the new Sheridan road bridge and to care for them during the season be accepted with thanks.

The Gordon Fireworks Company of Chicago will fire two immense programs of the best patriotic and diversified fireworks, Chas. M. Kennedy of Woodstock having the supervision. Mr. Kennedy is manager of the Woodstock fair.

Two baseball games between the McHenry team and Libertyville, on Saturday and the Chicago Union Giants—colored team—will play Libertyville Sunday.
