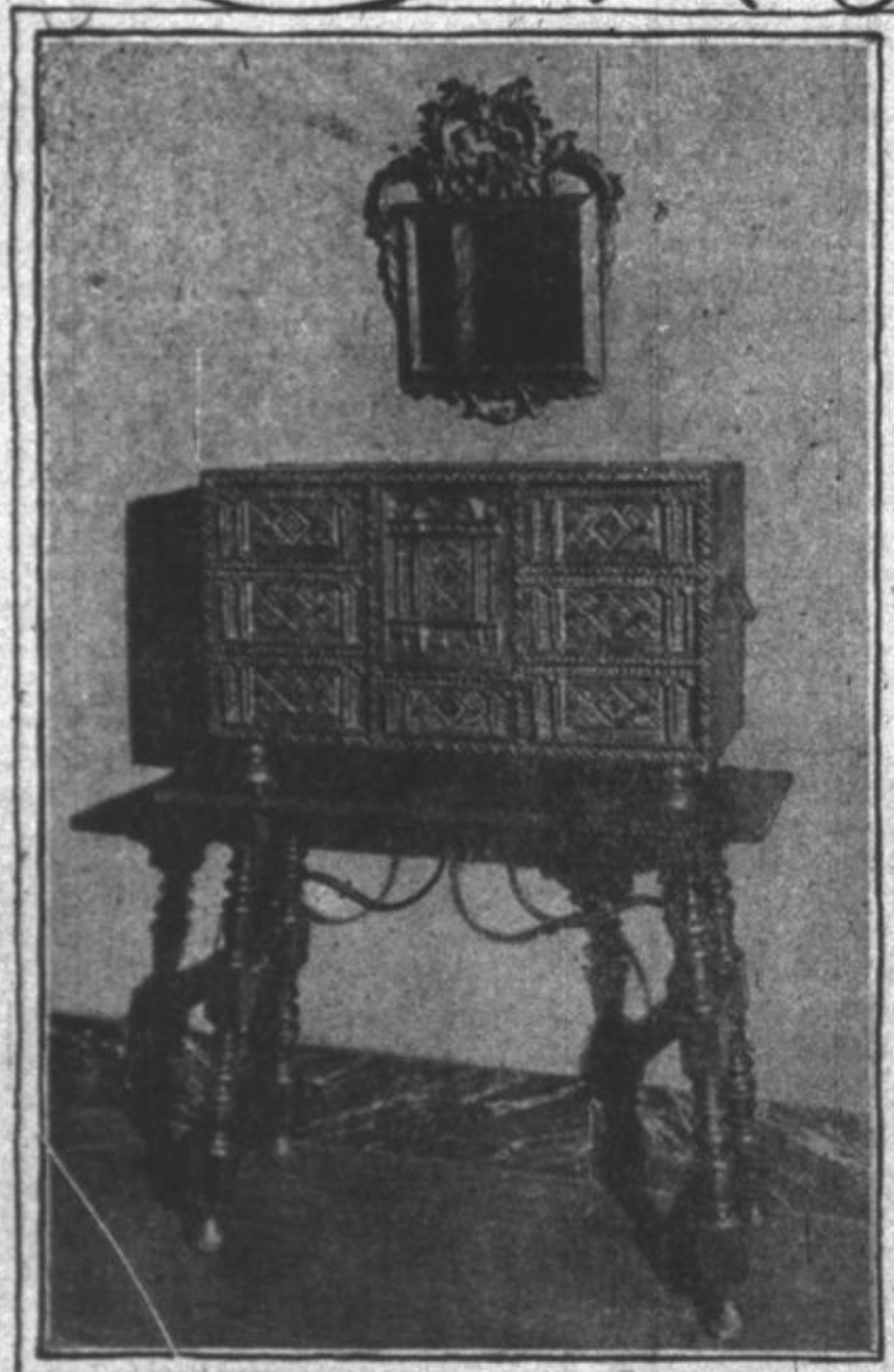

Pictured here is an antique Spanish Vargueno stand in walnut, 17th Century original gilding and polychroming. The small door in the center opens revealing 3 drawers brilliantly colored—a particularly fine specimen. Small Spanish mirror 17th Century carved walnut, original gilding and mirror. The design of the carving is typically Spanish and so different from the Italian or French. This type of Vargueno is a Papalera being used for papers and treasures. The other type has a flap that drops in front and can be used as a writing desk.
