SILVER DOLLARS WON'T CIRCULATE

Efforts of Treasury Officials to Make Them Popular Are Failure, Report

The effort made by the Treasury officials to get the public in the habit of accepting silver dollars along with the one dollar bills seems to have met with failure. The silver dollars go into circulation but they do not stay there. Every one in the effete east seems to prefer paper money and those who take it evidently are willing to run the risk of getting germs along with it

There was a famine of one dollar bills recently. The demand for them was so great that the Bureau of Engraving could not keep up with it, and this led to the effort to put the silver dollar back into circulation. The one dollar bills seem to deterioriate faster than they used to. Every purchase of gasoline at a filling station or garage seems to involve one or more dollar bills and the contact of grease and gas deteriorates the bills so rapidly that they do not ordinarily at this late date live out their allotted eight months of time.

But it seems that in spite of the fact that the silver dollar is clean, defies grease and will last indefinitely, the people prefer the dollar that is made of paper. So the treasury department is speeding up the production of one dollar bills and hopes to catch up with the demand in the near future. And the last move to popularize the silver dollar seems to have been a failure. Even Colonel Bryan has forgotten his old love and is otherwise busily engaged in fighting the Darwinian theory.

WINNETKA PLANNING AVIATION MEASURE

Ordinance Regulating Flying Over Village is Being Considered

The village council of Winnetka has under consideration "An Ordinance Relating to Aeroplanes or other Aircraft operating from or over the Village of Winnetka." The ordinance has been tentatively drafted and some action regarding it will probably be taken in the near future.

Complaints of residents concerning the operation of a plane, which is being used to take up passengers from a landing field on Hibbard road on the outskirts of the village, led to the consideration of the new ordinance, which is modeled after a similar one in Chicago, it is said.

Residents complain that this plane disturbs them on Sundays, when taking off and landing, and that it has been used for stunt purposes, as recently, when a parachute drop was made from it. The ordinance provides that no trick or stunt flying shall be done over the village and that airplanes shall fly not lower than 2,000 feet when passing over the vil-lage except at the beginning or end of a flight. It also provides that no one shall discharge, throw out or cause to be dropped, ballast, instruments, tools, containers, handbills cards or other matter whatsoever.' except over such a place as may in the future be provided for such a

The council is carefully considering the proposed ordinance, as it does not wish to conflict in any way with commercial aviation, which the government is encouraging as a preparedness measure. The ordinance, as drafted, provides for a fine of from \$25 to \$200 for each offense.

FAMOUS VIOLINIST ON WINNETKA LIST

Albert Spalding, famous American violinist, has been engaged by the Winnetka Music club as one of the artists in next seasons' series of concerts to be given under, auspices of that organization.

Though he has lived in Florence many years, Chicago still claims Mr. Spalding as her own and among those few who return again and again as soloists with the Chicago Symphony orchestra, he is welcomed the most warmly and remains the prime favorite.

Mr. Spalding has never been a spectacular player nor a sudden meteor in the American musical firmament, but his performances have gradually matured and ripened from season to season, until now it would be quite safe to number him among the leading half dozen violinists in the world.
