Earlier in Year
The month of January had fifty-
three permits, with a construction
cost of \$844,190; February, sixty-
three at \$506,730; March, 136 at \$1,
503,320; April, 175 at \$1,480,220, and
May, 152 permits representing a con-
struction value of \$1,208,250. With
one day's permit for the present
month, July bids fair to surpass June
in Evanston building.

City Improvements
Improvements totaling \$100,000
were approved at an open hearing of
the Evanston board of local improve-
ments last night. Of nine projects be-
fore the board only one, that of widen-
ing Chicago avenue from Church to
Grove streets, was voted down.

The Chicago avenue improvement
was passed up after a group of citi-
zens representing the property affect-
ed appeared before the board and en-
tered objections.

Fear that the widening would turn
the thoroughfare into a business district
caused the citizens to oppose the pro-
ject. Loss of a number of shade trees
which the widening would necessitate
also caused the objection to be en-
tered.

Other improvements passed by the
board were: Paving of Isabella street,
from Reese to the city limits; paving
of Hull street, from Ridge to Asbury;
paving of Cleveland street from As-
bury to Wesley; paving of Marcy,
from Central to Grant; paving of al-
ley in block forty-one; paving of al-
ley in block eighteen, North Evanston;
construction of sewers of Oakton,
Kenney and Grey streets.
