**AMERICAN NURSE IS  
HONORED IN GREECE**

**Selected Head of New Nurses'  
Training School Establish-  
ed in Athens**

Tribute to the efficiency of the American trained nurse has been accorded by the appointment of Miss Katherine MacFarland of Germantown, Pa., as the director of the new nurses' training school which Admiral Coundouriotis, President of Greece, has established in Athens. It is to be a permanent expression of the gratitude of the Greek people for the service which the Near East Relief has rendered to them in their days of distress.

Miss MacFarland, whose father is a professor in the University of Pennsylvania Medical school and an eminent writer of medical books, came to Greece three years ago and has figured prominently as one of the heroines of the Smyrna disaster, as director of an orphanage of two thousand children, and as a cool and courageous figure in a theatre panic where she was responsible for saving many lives.

Her selection is a tribute to the skill and proficiency of American nursing and to the splendid type of women produced by American nursing schools.

**RECLAIM BIG AREA  
OF LAND IN STATE**

More than 100,000 acres of land in the central part of the state which in previous years had not been farmed because of flood and water conditions, are made tillable through the use of electrically driven pumps.

This land is only a part of the millions of acres in the Mississippi valley which are being reclaimed by use of electricity. These lands are said to be the most fertile and produce the greatest crops when it is possible to farm them, because they consist of a deep layer of silt which is deposited by the rivers during their flood stages.

When the normal level of the Illinois river was raised several feet through the completion of the drainage canal at Chicago, which reversed the direction of the Chicago river, the inundation of thousands of acres along the Illinois river resulted.

Sanitary districts were organized, levees to confine the river at flood tides built and ditches dug to carry the seepage and excess rain water to a central point. Here pumping stations were erected to lift the water over the levees into the river.

The pumping stations many times were located in places inaccessible to railroads or wagon transportation and the problem of supplying them with fuel led to their electrification.

Hundreds of these drainage districts have been organized along the Mississippi and Illinois rivers, which, with the aid of electricity, have assisted in reclaiming great areas of exceptionally fertile farm land.

**TOURS BY FORD IN  
KUBLA KHAN LAND**

Entering the land of Kubla Khan in a Ford was the experience of William Douglas Burden of New York. Mr. Burden started soon after his graduation from Harvard upon a trip around the world. He contributes to the July Scribner's Magazine an article "Chasing Antelope on the Great Mongolian Plateau." He describes traffic conditions in Mongolia as follows:

The trail that we followed is the great caravan route between Central Asia and China. It was as crowded as Fifth avenue. All the camel caravans from Uрга, all the shepherds driving their flocks, all Chinese from the inner Mongolian Plains with their mule-teams, their ox-carts, and their horses must pass between the narrow

walls of the west gate. The jams of traffic at this point I have never seen the equal of. It is bedlam let loose, to begin with, and the effect that one wretched little Ford produces makes it just ten times as bad. Horses, frightened by the roar of the engine, are rearing, kicking, and breaking loose from their harness, while struggling Chinamen hang on to the animals' heads and hold caps over their eyes. And all the while the strange shouts of Chinese drivers, the cracking of whips and the barking of dogs fill the air. Up on the high wall above the gate some one hundred Chinese squat on their haunches and gaze serenely down upon the scene of turmoil."
